

FIGHTERS MAKE READY FOR FAST NEWPORT BOUTS

Rusey Green of Salem and Harry Davis of Astoria are to meet in one of the scheduled four-round preliminaries.

H. H. Schocker is leaving today for Newport to get the arena started. The arena is to have a seating capacity of 3000. Tickets are going good so far and it is expected that they will have a record breaking crowd. The match is being sponsored by the American Legion.

They are also planning on having a wrestling match for the 5th of July, although they have nothing definite planned as yet. They will have Robin Reed scheduled in case they decide to have the match.

HOMESEEKERS ARE POURING IN

From all points of the compass, homeseekers come pouring into Oregon.

A total of 189 families, desiring to locate on Oregon farms, have been reported by the gateway offices at Ashland, Ontario, Or., Green River, Wyo., Portland municipal auto camp and the Los Angeles branch office of the Portland chamber of commerce, since June 1.

Forty-one of these prospective settlers have called personally at the office of the land settlement department, Portland, and been given information and assistance in locating.

So far for the month of June, 24 families have already been located on the land in various parts of the state, representing a capital investment of over \$150,000. W. G. Ide, manager, state that complete reports for the month have not yet been received from the various counties, and that no

doubt this number will be greatly increased.

Thirteen settlers have been reported for Josephine county, one for Klamath, one for Deschutes, and ten by the Czechoslovak chamber of commerce of Chicago, who have located in various parts of the Willamette valley. A few of the new settlers are: John Thunby of Minnesota, 160 acres at Molalla; Joseph Doetal, of South Dakota, 33 acres at McMinnville; J. P. Hroza, South Dakota, 62 acres at Butteville; Frank Kilma, North Dakota, 31 acres at Woodburn; James Krijel, Illinois, and John Benes, Wisconsin, 121 acres at Whiteson; E. E. Stump, California, 5 acres at Bear Creek; Sherman Ware, California, 50 acres, Josephine county; Harvey G. Hoffmaster, Arizona, 10 acres in Josephine county; Thomas Gaffey, California, 80 acres in Josephine county, and Emma L. Garrot, Arizona, 3 acres near Grants Pass.
