

### HAYNES TO SEEK GOVERNORSHIP

Washington, July 1.—Roy A. Haynes may soon close four eventful years as prohibition commissioner to contest for the governorship of Ohio. The commissioner is not ready yet to make any formal announcement but a conference of his supporters will be held here soon to consider the move.

Mr. Haynes, who was said to have been persuaded by President Coolidge to abandon his plans to run for the governorship last November as a prohibition candidate, would seek the republican nomination for the office now held by Governor A. V. Donahoe, democrat, in his second term. If he enters the primary, Mr. Haynes will be campaigning at the same time as will Senator Willis, republican, Ohio, if the latter seeks reelection.

The commissioner and the senator are old friends and it is not expected that Mr. Willis will oppose the arrangement.

Commissioner Haynes expects to hold his office until August 1 at least, when next procedure in prohibition enforcement ordered by Assistant Secretary Andrews of the treasury becomes effective. The new system provides for radical reorganization.

### VORACIOUS COWS CAUSE AGITATION IN QUENSEL

Quensel, B. These pact governments rule Victoria and the Commonwealth, but a campaign recently launched by farmers of this region indicates that they will take the field on their own hook.

### LONDON TRAINS BEAR RACE HORSES' NAMES

London, Eng.—The London and Northeastern railway has revived a custom of the old stage coach days, when every coach had its name, and now gives every locomotive a title instead of a number.

The first of a series will be named for well known race horses, some of the new locomotives being labelled "Flying Fox," "Ormonde," "Hermit," "Ladas," "Parsimonian," "Robert Le Diable," "Dunovan," "Doncaster," and other notable runners of the turf.

The Southern railway also has adopted the idea, naming its engines for well known men. "His Majesty," the largest locomotive on the line is one, and "The Prince of Wales," another.
