

# TWENTY HOMERS IN SINGLE DAY SET FANS AGOG

New York, July 2.—(A. P.)—Twenty big league home runs, all in the same afternoon, are giving the fans considerable food for argument today as to the lively ball. Seven of the big blows were made by the Giants as they won a double header from the Phillies and returned to first place ahead of the Pirates.

Irish Mousie elected for the circuit in the first game which the McGraw clan won 6 to 4, and then slammed two more in the concluding number which the Giants won 16 to 7. Hack Wilson contributed two in the second melee for the Giants, both coming in one inning, his club made nine runs. He feat tied the modern record established in 1922 by Ken Williams of the St. Louis Browns.

Babe Ruth's bat, long dormant, tuned in and hung up a pair in the fray with the Red Sox, helping the Yankees to win, 11 to 8. He is now credited with five homers this season. His team mate, Bob Meusel, who is a brother of Irish Mousie, poked out his 19th bagger of the year. The Robins yesterday trounced the Braves, 4 to 3, Milton Stock's triple in the ninth paving the way for victory. Neale of Boston participated in the home run carnival with two heavy drives.

The Pirates came from behind in the seventh and scored six runs, batting Alexander out of the box as they won from the Cubs, 3 to 6. Wright's homer, with one on base knotting the score at the start of the seventh inning.

Gabby Hartnett, Chicago catcher, registered his 17th Ruthian 'ap of the year.

After dropping the first section of a twin engagement to the Indians, 11 to 0, the Regals came back for the aftermath, 4 to 1.

The Browns started to crowd Detroit for fourth place by top-

ping the White Sox 5 to 6. Ken Williams in augured his return to the Browns' lineup by smashing out his sixteenth homer of the season.

Other circuit clouters yesterday were Frank Snyder and Pop Young of the Giants, Tod of the Red Sox, Leotheo of the Cubs, McNulty of the Indians, and Collins and Hooper of the White Sox. Twelve homers were made by National League players.

# SCOPES SISTER IS REFUSED JOB

Dayton, Tenn., July 2.—Surprise was expressed here today at the reported action of the Paducah, Ky., board of education in declining the application of a sister of John T. Scopes for a position in the high school of that city.

Miss Lela V. Scopes was told by the superintendent there yesterday that her services would not be required when she declined to say that she did not believe in the theory of evolution.

Scopes is to go on trial here July 10 for violating the Tennessee anti-evolution law.

Miss Scopes has taught mathematics at Paducah two years.

A member of the school board is quoted as saying that Miss Scopes' presence in the high school faculty might embarrass the public school system. The young woman is now attending the University of Kentucky.

Information was awaited here today as to the outcome of a conference of leading defense attorneys held in New York last night. It was believed the some plan of procedure had been outlined there by the conferees, who included Clarence Darrow, Bainbridge Colby, John R. Neal of Knoxville; Dudley Field Malone and Arthur Garfield Hays, the last named being an attorney for the American Civil Liberties Union, which is aiding Scopes' defense.

# FRENCH TO NAME DEBT ENVOYS TO AMERICA SOON

Paris, July 2.—(A. P.)—The French government is preparing to make an announcement upon the American debt question within a few days. It will probably be limited to scarcely more than naming the mission to go to Washington.

French debt negotiations with the United States will be kept strictly apart from those with Great Britain.

There is much caution here because of the apparent conviction both in the American state department and in the French foreign office that any public mention of the terms of payment by either side would complicate negotiations and might even defeat their purposes.

# SOVIET DENIES ACTION IN CHINA

Moscow, July 2.—(A. P.)—Foreign Minister Tchitcherin has issued a statement asserting that although the sympathies of the Russians are on the side of the Chinese in their struggle for complete liberation from foreign domination the soviet's policy is to avoid any action which could be regarded as intervention in China's internal affairs.

The statement was prompted by the increasing attacks upon soviet Russia in the English newspapers in connection with the present situation in China, coupled with the recent speech of Loughborough by Lord Girkenhead, which is regarded here as official sanction for these attacks.

"Sympathy does not mean intervention," says Tchitcherin in retorting statement that Russia is interested in prolonging the state of chaos in China and desires to assume the role of protector."
