ST. PAUL PLANS TO REBUILD AT ONCE IS REPORT

St. Paul is not to be outdone by
 Santa Barbara.
 Marion county's north end city
 will arise out of the ashes of its
 recent fire—and arise this sum-
 mer. Were it not an unwork-
 expression it might be said truthfully
 that St. Paul will do the Phoenix
 act.
 St. Paul didn't have an earth-
 quake, but it had a fire a few days
 ago before Santa Barbara had her
 earthquake. In the fire Joe Eaton's
 blacksmith shop, McDonald's post
 office and Berner's residence were
 destroyed by the devastating con-
 flagration. It may also be said
 truthfully that in proportion, the
 holocaust was just as serious to
 St. Paul as the earthquake was to
 Santa Barbara, even if St. Paul
 didn't get as many columns of As-
 sociated Press copy as did Santa
 Barbara.
 It is learned from an authorita-
 tive source, that St. Paul, seized
 with the spirit of the times, al-
 ready is one the road to a bigger,
 brighter and better city.
 The first step toward recon-
 struction already has taken place.
 Joe Eaton is starting to rebuild
 his blacksmith shop, and it may be
 said, without fear of successful
 contradiction, that the new Joe
 Eaton blacksmith shop will be far
 superior to the one that was
 swallowed up by flames. Already
 consideration has been given to
 the reconstruction of the McDon-
 ald postoffice building, and from
 the same authoritative source it
 is learned that a new postoffice
 building will go up some time next
 summer.
 While no definite word has been
 received, it is considered well
 within the realm of possibility—
 very probably—that the Berner
 residence also will be rebuilt. This
 belief is founded on the fact that
 out of all of the losses, the Berner
 residence was the only one on
 which insurance was carried.
 St. Paul is on her way, and it
 is an even bet she will be rebuilt
 and functioning at the old stand-
 ard about what she intends to do.
