

SALEM CHAMBER MEMBERS GUESTS OF DALLAS CLUB

Dallas, Or., July 3.—Representatives of Dallas and Salem chambers of commerce met last night at a banquet... The Dallas chamber of commerce by the Dallas chamber of commerce... and prosperity of the two counties as the chief topic of the various speakers formed the program of the evening.

Representative W. V. Fuller told of the five convention work in Polk and Lincoln counties over which he has charge. He later called attention to the wonderful view obtainable on clear days from the top of Bald mountain, southwest of Falls City. State Senator L. J. Toomey of Salem spoke of a need of a change in the state line plant situation and the benefit that would accrue to both Polk and Marion counties through the relocation of the plant and the utilization of convict labor.

Oscar Hayter of Dallas brought out the advantage to Salem and Dallas of the early completion of an all-year highway through Polk county to connect with the Corvallis-Newport highway through Kings valley and the Tillamook highway via Butler hill and Wallace bridge. Andy Muir of Dallas also brought out the importance of the building of a "salt water" road from Dallas.

Fred Erickson of Salem told of his enthusiasm for the new line mill and spoke of the efforts Salem has been making the past few years to secure payroll industries.

Other speakers were: Dr. H. E. Morris, J. C. Perry, Dr. Fisher, Zedec Riggs, Judge Scott, U. G. Holt, Ross Miles, all of Salem, and Mayor Stratton, William Harobe, Dr. V. C. Standa, J. R. Craven and L. D. Brown, all of Dallas.

Cook Patton of Salem entertained with some sleight of hand tricks. King Ding Perry promised to bring the Cherrin band to Dallas later in the summer. The best of spirit prevailed throughout the meeting and much good fellowship was in evidence. About 60 were present at the banquet.

STATE WILL GET OREGON FRIDAY

Portland, Or., July 3.—On the twenty-seventh anniversary of her historic engagement in the battle of Santiago, the U. S. S. Oregon, one of the "hulldoes of the navy" will be presented by the government to the state of Oregon.

The famous old battleship, spared by the Washington treaty on armaments as a relic, now lies in the Willamette river under a bridge here, silenced, partly dismantled. Her breeches are welded and her muzzles spiked.

The Oregon will be manned in future by a superintendent, two assistants and a watchman and within certain hours daily will be open to public inspection.

DEAF IN CONVENTION SCORE CONTROL BOARD

Portland, Or., July 3.—The third biennial convention of the Oregon Association for the Deaf opened here last night at Al Azar temple with C. H. Lindo, president presiding.

Lindo scored the state board of control, saying that its members were more interested in paper economy than in the educational needs of the state school for the deaf. He paid tribute to Thomas Hopkins Gallaudet and Edward Miner Gallaudet, founders of an institution of higher learning for the deaf.

HENNESSY AND CASEY REACH SEMI-FINALS

Wimbledon, July 3.—John Hennessy, of Indianapolis, and Ray Casey of San Francisco entered the semi-finals of the doubles of the all-England tennis championship by defeating the British pair, F. R. L. Crawford and F. M. B. Fisher, 6-4, 4-6, 6-0, 6-1.

Three matches, the semi-finals of the men's singles and the doubles play between the Americans and the British, proved a big drawing card, although the day was the hottest of the tournament. Casey and Hennessy hardly got warmed up in their easy match. The one set they lost was due largely to overdriving.

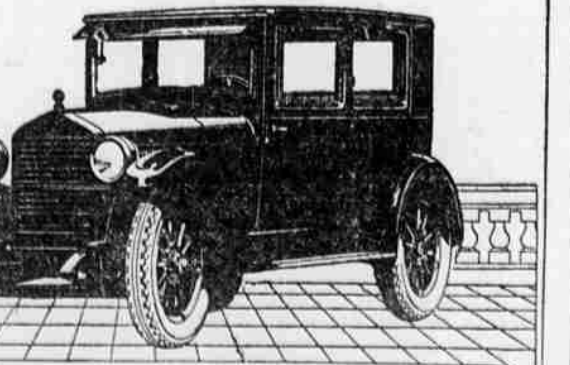
