OLD THEATER IS
REMODELED FOR
STORE PURPOSES

Active work of remodeling the
Liberty theater into a store build-
ing will begin Monday. Workmen
have been removing the seats, or-
gan and other theater equipment
for the past two days, and will
finish this week.
The new store, which will be one
of the Cosmopolitan chain, will be
the sixth to be established in the
Willamette valley, where the chain
office will handle a general
line of goods, including groceries
and other staples. The character-
istic feature of the Cosmopolitan
store is the price of goods, the
highest being one dollar for any
one article.
Judge Peter D'Arcy of Salem
built the Liberty theater 15 years
ago. It has been among the fore-
most theaters in the city, pictures
being shown there practically from
the time the moving picture indus-
try started until this week.
The floors will be raised at the rear
end of a building, making it level
for use as a store. Shelves and
other fixtures will be constructed
for use by the Cosmopolitan prop-
rietors. The front of the place
will be entirely remodelled, win-
dows for display of goods being
built.
The store is expected to be ready
for business by the middle of
August.

MRS. COOLIDGE
NEARLY STRUCK
BY MOTORCYCLE

Swampscott, Mass., July 3—
(AP)—Mrs. Coolidge barely escap-
ed being run down by a motor-
cycle this morning during a walk
about Swampscott a leap to the
side of the road saving her.
She was returning to White Court
and had just turned into the pri-
vate driveway when four members
of the state constabulary on motor-
cycles turned into the lane behind
her. Driving at a fast clip, accord-
ing to witnesses, the motorcy-
cle officers were behind her almost
before anyone was aware.
The grinding of brakes and a
yell by James Hately, her accom-
panier, made Mrs. Coolidge hear
only warning and as she jumped
to one side of the road the lead-
ing machine shot between her and
Hately.
The motorcycle detachment,
which was coming to White Court
to escort the president to Cam-
bridge, proceeded to the summer
White House without stopping.

BIG TIMBER DEAL
IS NEGOTIATED

Portland, Or., July 3.—Negotia-
tions were reported today to have
here late yesterday for transfer of
500,000,000 feet of pine timber
and other property on the Klamath
division of the Southern Pacific
railroad from L. B. Menefee to
the Forest Lumber company of Lou-
isville, Ky. L. B. White, an asso-
ciate of Menefee. The company
is represented here by C. J.
Shepard, manager of its lumber
operations in the southern pine
section.
The timber tract included in
the deal is owned by the federal
government, under contract of
sale to the Menefee Pine company,
organized a few years ago by J. O.
Goldthwaite. He afterward sold it
to Menefee. Goldthwaite recent-
ly obtained an option for the pur-
chase of the property from Menefee.
Besides the timber, 20 miles of
logging railroad, a mill site, plan-
ing mill, dry kilns and a quantity
of logging equipment are involved
in the transfer.
