

### ASTORIA PLANS ENTERTAINMENT FOR MIDSHIPMEN

Astoria, Or., July 9.—Tentative plans for the entertainment of the officers, midshipmen and sailors who will visit Astoria, July 19 to 21, on the three battleships taking the Annapolis men on their cruise, have been completed by the chamber of commerce committee and submitted to Rear Admiral Vogelzang, cruise commander.

Members of the Portland and Astoria naval base committee will lay the need for the base before the Secretary of Navy Willbur and will give him every opportunity to inspect the site of the base.

The warships are scheduled to arrive here about noon on July 19, Sunday afternoon and evening will be given over to Seattle, no attempt being made to entertain the naval men in Astoria. On Monday morning a parade of the battleships, seamen and marines, headed by the bands of the battleships, will be held on the streets of Astoria and will be followed by a boxing smoker.

In the afternoon ball games will be played between teams from the ships and in the evening there will be dances in several Astoria halls for the midshipmen and officers and a banquet for Secretary of the Navy Willbur and the officers of the squadron. The ships will leave some time Tuesday.

### FIVE SIXTHS OF BOOZE ARRESTS LEAD TO FINES

Out of 158 arrests made during the month of May there were 121 convictions in the state for prohibition law violations, according to the May report of William S. Levins, state prohibition commissioner. Fines assessed aggregate \$29,185 and fines paid \$971,30. Stillis seized numbered 29 and liquor destroyed 916 gallons. Twenty-four counties reported and 12 did not report. These statistics are not alone from officers of the state prohibition department, but also from sheriffs and district attorneys.

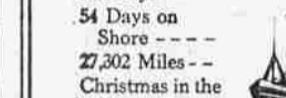

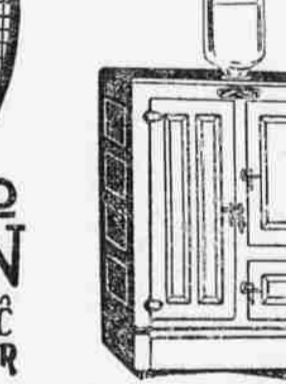
