

### RACING PROGRAM FOR STATE FAIR IS ANNOUNCED

Details of harness and running events at the Oregon state fair next fall were made public yesterday by Wayne Stewart, who has charge of the race program. Pursuant to an announced agreement a total of \$21,700, including \$4900 for training events, the remainder being for harness events. Purse ranges from \$250 to \$2000 each for harness races and from \$100 to \$1000 each for running events. Harness races will be as follows:

Monday, September 28—2.15 pace, 3 heats, and two-year-old colt race, pacers and trotters (mixed), purses \$1000 and \$250. Tuesday—2.15 trot and 3:25 pace, each 3 heats, purses \$1000 and \$500. Wednesday—2.08 pace, 3 in 5, and 2:25 trot, 3 heats, purses \$2000 and \$500. Thursday—2:12 trot, 3 in 5, and 2:10 pace, 3 heats, purses \$2000 and \$1000. Friday—free-for-all trot, 3 in 5; 2:30 pace, 3 heats, and consolation pace, 3 heats, purses \$1000, \$800 and \$250. Saturday—free-for-all pace, 3 in 5; 2:20 trot, 3 heats, and consolation trot, 3 heats, purses \$1000, \$800 and \$250. Highlights of the running events are as follows:

### Finances of State Institutions All In Healthy Shape

With the exception of the state soldiers' home at Roseburg, all of the 10 state institutions that are operated mainly by appropriations of the legislature were well within their financial allowances, most of them with big margins to play on at the end of the month of June, which marked the close of the first quarter of the present plenum. That the soldiers' home is behind does not indicate that it will have to appeal to the emergency board, or that it will be behind at the end of the two years, for the reason that it receives considerable money from the federal government and will receive further remittance before the biennium closes.

Neither is the fact that the other institutions are ahead so far necessarily prophetic that they will keep ahead the remainder of the two years. Haring fires or other disasters, however, it is probable that the larger institutions, at least, will pull through without deficits. The employment institution for the adult blind in Portland is not included in the list below for the reason that it is maintained by a millage levy of 1-23 mill annually, estimated to produce \$85,000 this biennium, while the estimated requirements of the institution for the two years are \$12,000. For want of a better term the figures in the table below represent:

senting the margin between what has actually been spent at the several institutions and what could have been spent and still allowed the superintendents to keep within their appropriations are called "savings," though they are not really savings. In some cases these run into many thousands of dollars, but do not indicate that the institutions have been over-appropriated for the reason that lump sum expenditures may reduce the margins greatly, particularly with reference to capital outlay. The eastern Oregon hospital and the state feeble minded institution, for example, must pay large sums for new buildings for which contracts have been let. The financial condition of each institution is as follows: State hospital for the insane—Appropriation, \$887,425; available for six months, \$221,856.50; actually expended during six months, \$221,350.93; saved, \$505.57; appropriation remaining, \$665,074.57. State penitentiary—Appropriation, \$350,000; available for six months, \$87,500; actually expended, \$78,869.50; saved, \$8,630.50; appropriation remaining, \$271,130.50. Institution for feeble minded—Appropriation, \$417,250; available for six months, \$104,312.50; actually expended, \$82,530.25; saved, \$21,782.25; appropriation remain-
