## PRESBYTERIANS WILL DEDICATE STUDENT HOUSE

University of Oregon, Eugene, July 15.—The dedication next Saturday, July 15, of the \$16,000 Westminster house, built for the use of Presbyterian students on a site adjoining the campus at Fourteenth and Kincaid streets, will be an important event on the program of the annual session of the Presbyterian synod of Oregon, held on the campus this week.

Westminster house, which is of the English cottage style, was constructed on the outside of the 160 feet of frontage presented on a gift to the synod by two donors, Dr. B. C. Brown and his brother, Dr. S. A. Brown. It faces the site of the future new university library on the east, and the lot that has been purchased by the university regents for the new student union on the north. To the west of Westminster house is the Craftsman's club, the university Masonic organization.

Westminster house, according to Rev. Bruce J. Giffon, university pastor, is distinctly a church organization for the religious needs of Presbyterian students on the campus. Bible classes will be held in Westminster, hall Sunday mornings for the young men and women of the university. Vesper services will be held there Sunday evening, and groups for religious study will be organized also.

The Rev. Mr. Giffon and Mrs. Giffon will live in the pastor's apartment in Westminster house, and will serve as host and hostess at the various school functions held for the students.
