

NEW SUIT TO BE FILED TO TEST EVOLUTION LAW

Washington, July 31—(AP)—Washington's evolution suit, started with a shout, has died in a whisper, but its sponsors assert it will shortly be revived on a firmer basis.

Withdrawn yesterday on the eve of the date set for argument on the government's motion to dismiss the suit, attorneys for Loren H. Wittner, the government clerk, who filed it announced that in taking this action, they planned to file another suit designed to survive objections raised against the complaint as first drawn. Among other objections raised, the government, in its motion to dismiss, cited precedents which it held denied Wittner's right as a taxpayer to suit to prevent payment of salaries to school officials here responsible for certain biological teaching in the schools. The complaint held such instruction to be in violation of a provision of the District of Columbia appropriation bill against teaching disrespect for the Holy Bible.

To strengthen his case Wittner announced he would not only file his next suit as a taxpayer in the District of Columbia but also would seek to have a local taxpayer, with children attending public schools here join as co-plaintiff in the action. In drawing up his new bill Wittner is being assisted by the Rev. H. M. Lawson, pastor of the Maryland Avenue Baptist church.

VANCOUVER TO CELEBRATE HER CENTENNIAL

Vancouver, Wash., July 31—(Special)—Vancouver is making preparations for the reception of thousands of visitors during the week beginning August 17 when the oldest city in the state of Washington will open the celebration of its Centennial. It was in 1825 that Dr. John McLaughlin came to this place and, as chief factor of the Hudson Bay company, established the trading post here which he called Fort Vancouver and from which he ruled the Oregon empire from California on the south to the North Pole and from the Pacific ocean to the Rocky mountains. Under special act of congress the minting of half dollar pieces commemorating the Vancouver

centennial is now under way and on August 8 the first consignment is to be shipped from the San Francisco mint. These coins have a profile of Dr. John McLaughlin on one side and of old Fort Vancouver on the other side and they are unique in that unlike all other coin issues since the Columbian exposition at Chicago they bear the name of the town at which the celebration is held thereon. The directors of the centennial have ordered but a limited minting of this coin, and already have thousands of orders for these at one dollar each. The celebration, underwritten by local capital is hoping to meet a large part of its expense through the sale of these coins.

The celebration will consist of an industrial and automobile exposition, a large outdoor amusement park, a pageant with 310 persons and chorus of 150 each night for the week beginning August 17, and a wonderful historical exhibit which has been prepared under the auspices of Glenn M. Ranck of this city, with the co-operation of the Oregon Historical Society and the Washington Historical Society.

Opening exercises, set for August 17, will attract notable persons from the two states and a big reception for that date has been planned. The governors of Washington and Oregon and the congressional delegations from the two states, with mayors of many of the cities, have been invited to participate in these exercises.

ALBINA IRON WORKS BURNED

Portland, Or., July 31.—The Albina marine iron works, part of the Cornfoot shipyard of war time, was destroyed by fire early today. The damage was estimated at \$100,000, only a small part of which was covered by insurance.

William Cornfoot, head of the Albina marine iron works, was unable to say this morning whether the plant would be rebuilt.

The flames swept the street at one time and attacked the warehouse of the Northwest Sales company, but firemen prevented serious loss to that structure. The cause of the fire had not been learned this morning.

The fire was discovered in the southeast corner of the huge building occupied by the iron work and had gained great headway when firemen arrived. The fire was spectacular, the flames lighting the sky over the whole city.
