AUTO FATALITIES SHOW INCREASE

Washington, Aug. 3.—The department of commerce announces that reports of automobile fatalities in 1925 have been received from 27 cities of 100,000 population or more. Thirty-six of these cities show more automobile fatalities in the four week period ending July 18 than in the previous four-week period. The following seven cities show no fatalities for the last four weeks: Bridgeport, Norfolk, Oakland, Oklahoma City, Spokane, Springfield, Mass., and Tacoma. New Bedford, with two deaths still holds the record for 1925.
