

THRIFT PLAN FOR PHONE EMPLOYEES PUT IN EFFECT

Inauguration of the American Telephone and Telegraph company thrift plan for the purchase of company stock on partial payment arrangements will be effective in Salem Saturday through an office authorized by the state corporation commissioner. W. H. Dancy, manager of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company announced the new plan today.

This office will be a branch of the Bell Telephone Securities company, which was formed several years ago to pioneer the direct sales and partial payment thrift plan. Headquarters will be established in the main business office of the company at the telephone building and W. H. Dancy will be in direct charge of the transactions.

Every employee of the telephone company will be a salesman for the securities company and will take applications for purchase of the stock on either a cash or partial payment basis. Since a separate sales force will not be maintained there will be no added cost in operating the thrift plan.

Prior to extension of this arrangement to Oregon, purchasers of A. T. & T. stock had been forced to make direct purchases through brokers.

Mr. Dancy announced that the partial payment option provided for drafting of contracts providing for payment of \$10 per share per month. Interest of six per cent on all partial payments will be allowed and in the event a purchaser desires to cancel his agreement, his money will be returned plus four per cent.

"The stock purchases is not new or treasury stock," said Dancy, "but is stock that has been issued and listed on the New York Stock Exchange and is bought for purchasers through brokers who are members of the exchange."

"Employees of the company are offering free the facilities of their organization to assist investors in obtaining A. T. & T. stock either by cash or monthly payments. The American Telephone company has pioneered in this plan and during the past several years has placed more than 1,000,000 shares of stock with more than 125,000 individuals."

TO PAVE 15TH BEFORE WINTER

Property owners of North 15th street won their contention before the city council last night when the city aldermen voted to pave the street this season and place the fill at the bridge approach so the fill may be paved in another year. It is necessary for the fill to settle a year before being paved.

Alderman Williams made a spirited speech last night in favor of the project, informing the council that he had personally investigated twice. Alderman Galloway explained that the delay had been caused mainly by the fill and was not due to any reluctance to pave the street. Patton made the motion whereby action will be taken this season. He said that the street in the present condition is worse than any county road in the county.

GIRL MOUNTAIN CLIMBER FALLS 300 FEET TO DEATH

Everett, Wash., Aug. 4.—Mildred Hasselmen, 19, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Hasselmen, residing two miles west of Granite Falls, was instantly killed Sunday when she fell from the highest point on Mount Pilchuck. The girl was one of a party of boys and girls from the Granite Falls district climbing the mountain. With Harold Brandt, the girl against advice of older members of the party, tried

to climb a rocky crag on the north side. She fell 300 feet into a snow field and rolled several hundred feet. Brandt, endangering his life, went to the girl's aid, found her dead and notified the Pilchuck ranger station. The body was taken from the mountain by a party organized by rangers. The girl is survived by her parents and one brother.

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STRATTON LEADS FUNDAMENTALISTS NEW CAMPAIGN

New York, Aug. 4.—The leadership of the fundamentalist forces of which William Jennings Bryan was the outstanding figure has been offered to the Rev. John Roach Straton, pastor of Calvary Baptist church here and long a foe of modernism.

In making this announcement at Asbury Park, N. J., yesterday Dr. Straton said he was not at liberty to reveal the names of those who had urged him for the place. They were, however, prominent New Yorkers, who had formed an organization with which to prosecute a nation-wide war against the teaching of evolution in tax supported schools.

Dr. Straton said he would challenge Clarence Darrow to a series of from ten to twenty debates on evolution. New York, Chicago, Philadelphia and Atlanta are four cities he named as having already been selected for the debates. If Mr. Darrow declines, he said, Dudley Field Malone will be challenged.

In an address at Asbury Park last night, Dr. Straton blamed evolutionists "for the ethical collapse of the modern generation." "Monkey men make monkey morals," he said. "The modern dances reflect the prevailing philosophy of animalism. The theater is reeking with moral infamy as a result of its fleshly tendencies. It was this reflection of evolution philosophy that destroyed Germany."

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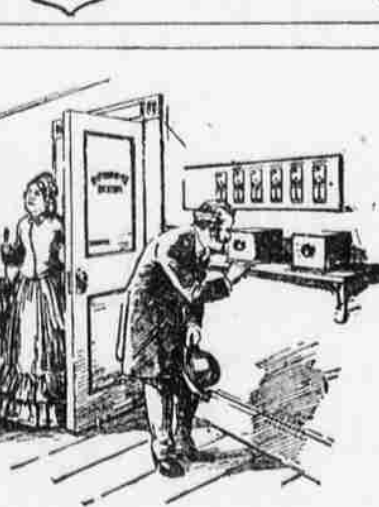
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Demand

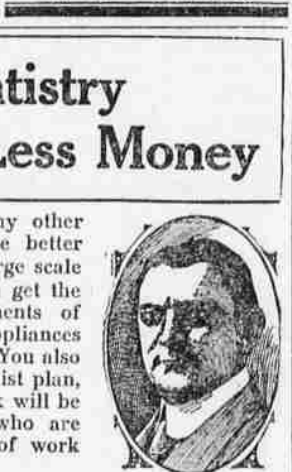
