

COINCIDENCE IN IDENTIFICATION PUZZLES POLICE

Chicago, Aug. 19.—A handsome dressed woman, who in a few moments of conscientious said she was Mrs. Elizabeth Wise of Hollywood, Cal., was still in a coma late yesterday after being taken from a Santa Fe railroad train here Monday.

Her identification of herself coincided with the result of an investigation in Hollywood where a Mrs. Elizabeth Wise was found to have lived at the same address until she left several days ago for an unannounced destination.

But reports from Bloomington, Ill., placed her as Mrs. William Wise, wife of the golf editor of the Los Angeles Times and formerly Miss Dorothy Van Pelt of Bloomington. Relatives could not be reached last night, nor was Mr. Wise found in Los Angeles though it was known that his wife had left for the east recently.

A man who said he was Charles Wise of a Chicago hotel said she was his sister in law, a widow and 27 years old, but no one was registered as Charles Wise at the hotel from which he said he came.

The woman carried a diary from which the name and other information had been torn. Her trunk contained valuable gowns and jewelry, a check for \$5000 and a travelers check for \$500 were found in her purse. In the purse also was a notebook leaf on which was written the name and address, she later gave.

Train officials said she became ill crossing New Mexico. During her lucid moments she said she had taken some pills. Attending physicians said they found traces of a sleeping potion in the stomach.

PHOTOGRAPHY IS ONE BIG FEATURE OF SUPER-FILM

Natural color photography is one of the great features of "The Ten Commandments," the wonderful Cecil B. DeMille production which opens its return engagement in Salem at the Grande theater next Tuesday, July 25. The photography of this picture, particularly the color work, shows equally with the acting of such stars as Theodore Roberts in making it one of the truly great pictures ever presented.

Concerning the photography Roy G. Pomeroy, technical director, says:
"We used what is known as the Technicolor process to film the Egyptian scenes. In them one sees the children of Israel crossing the desert. The bright barbaic colors of the thousands of people and their animals against the somber grey sands has a remarkable effect on the observer."

"Contrary to earlier developments in the field of color photography, these scenes do not flicker or cause eye-strain, neither do the colors run together. It is as clear as the ordinary film, and has that added quality of color which takes it out of the stereotype of spectacles. Engineers and photographers of the Technicolor company aided us in taking these scenes of 'The Ten Commandments.'"

"The only apparent difference in a color-equipped camera is that two films pass behind the lens simultaneously while in the ordinary camera but one film is used. Prisms separate the reds and greens of the scene being taken. Thus on one film are recorded the red tints and on the other the green."
"When they are combined at the laboratory, a red filter eliminates everything from the green film except the green, and a green filter eliminates from the red film all but the red. The two films are then cemented together in such a way that the finished print shows the blue, yellow, orange, gold and straw colors, as well as shades of green and red."

Newman Says Critics At Prison to Blame For Convict Escape

Portland, Aug. 19.—"I could have escaped a half dozen times Monday. I could have notified the authorities so that the convicts would have been captured," declared C. L. Newman, who lives near New Era and at whose house the desperados took refuge.

"But those three desperate men, had my wife, my two sons and my daughter as hostages and the first overt act on my part would have meant the murder of my family. My wife and children mean everything to me. Penitentiary officials had Murray, Wilkes and Kelly in cells, away from firearms. They let them escape, let them steal guns from the prison itself, let them slip through a cordon of guards and come to my home to terrorize me and my family."

Blame Laid on Officials
"I did what I think was right. I don't care what the warden or his deputies think of my conduct. If they had paid more attention to their business, this thing would never have happened."

Newman, resting after his experiences, under the shade of a tree in the yard of his little summer home, spoke earnestly. He pointed out the rock walk which the convicts allowed him to build at his place Monday. He showed the barn and garage on which the two boys worked. He showed the woods path which, by a sudden jump, he could have gained and shown which he could have sped to a telephone.

"I knew what it meant. The first overt act, the first appearance of a posse would have spelled slaughter for my family and the four young men from Monitor."

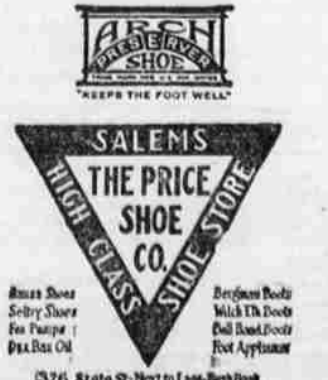
