

RAIN PREVENTS GAME ON SUNDAY

Old Jupiter Pluvius who sent showers down in torrents during Saturday and Sunday, the first ones for 72 days, halted several of the various sports scheduled for Saturday and Sunday. The Salem Senators, who were to cross bats with the fast Albany nine, had to cancel the game due to the rain.

The game could have been played but it was necessary for "Frisco" Edwards to inform the Albany team by 11 o'clock and at that time the rain was coming down in buckets full with no sign of abatement. Edwards has not as yet decided what he will do for a game next Sunday but promises the fans a good tough battle.

Rain also halted the motorcycle races at Independence. The race officials promised to carry on the races providing there was no more rain after 9 o'clock but the rain continued to fall and it was necessary to call them off. The races will be held next Sunday.

The team play scheduled at the Illabe Country club for yesterday was also postponed. It is not known whether the match will be played as the locals are to play the Albany team in a return match at Albany next Sunday. The locals won the first match. Tom Woods and Hildebrand were captains of the two teams.

CIRCUS PARADE IS AGAIN ELIMINATED

Owing to the increased size of the Ringling Brothers and Barnum & Bailey circus the time-honored parade was abandoned during the season of 1924 and for the same reason, the street pageant was omitted last season and again this year. There seems to be little chance of ever restoring it again as the big show of 1925 is even larger and heavier than those of past seasons.

As even the layman knows, the circus man's first business is to get the show paraphernalia and van properties from the railroad yards to the show grounds and then put them and the great tents in place. But, following the combine, there was so much of this work to be done that the parade often started late and frequently had to be cancelled altogether.

Last winter came the opportunity to secure an unusual number of new foreign acts and purchase still another of Europe's biggest trained horse shows. The Ringling Brothers did not hesitate. They immediately decided to "take on" these great new features, plus two herds of elephants, and a machine room for them by continuing to eliminate the properties and vehicles required for the street parade and the time taken in giving the parade.

"Our patrons are familiar with the trained animal innovations," said one of the show's agents yesterday, "but I promise you they will be wholly unprepared for the wonderful trained horse show that has now been added. More than 150 educated equines were transported from Europe by special boat last winter, accompanied by the experts who taught them. No such horses were ever before seen in America. The trained animal numbers have been varied by new displays. There are now five herds of elephants in the arena and on the stages in place of the customary three groups.

"Some idea of the equine displays may be had when it is stated that one hundred and fifty horses, each ridden by an expert, are presented in a mammoth equine ballet. Another section of the 1925 program exhibits five companies of performing horses—three troupes in the regular rings and two troupes in movable rings set upon the wooden stages. The latter is an innovation never before attempted.

The added horse show is not exhibited as a separate attraction, but is presented on the regular circus program in the main tent. In order that there might be room for all the rings and stages heretofore used in presenting men and women performers only it became necessary to increase the size of the canvas pavilion. This everywhere added to the weight of the circus equipment until, already unwieldy, it reached such proportions

SENATORIAL ELECTION IN IRISH FREE STATE

Dublin, Ireland.—The first elections to the Free State senate, heretofore an entirely nominated body, will take place this autumn. Because of the complicated system of election it is expected to take three months to determine the results. Of the 60 members, 15 are to be elected in addition to four who have been filling vacancies. The mode of election provided for a panel containing three times as many names as there are seats to be filled. The senate nominates one-third of this panel and the dual two-thirds. In addition outgoing senators may appear on the panel without nomination, so that for the 19 seats the panel will contain 76 names.

PETRIFIED OAK FOREST FOUND NEAR SPOKANE

Spokane, Wash.—Discovery of a petrified forest of giant oak trees believed to be the only one of its kind on the North American continent, has been made near the confluence of the Spokane and Columbia rivers in this state. E. M. Tardy, United States school inspector for the Indian department, now located on the Colville Indian reservation, announced the find, which was made by Dr. W. A. Johnston.

Owing to its difficulty of access, the forest has not yet been fully explored, but is known to extend for half a mile along the south bank of the Columbia. The trees are two to five feet in diameter and some 60 feet tall. "The forest, of what apparently was a growth similar to our oaks, grew on one of the first of the eight flows of basalt that partially covered that part of the state of Washington," Mr. Tardy said. "The trees then were covered by subsequent flows."
