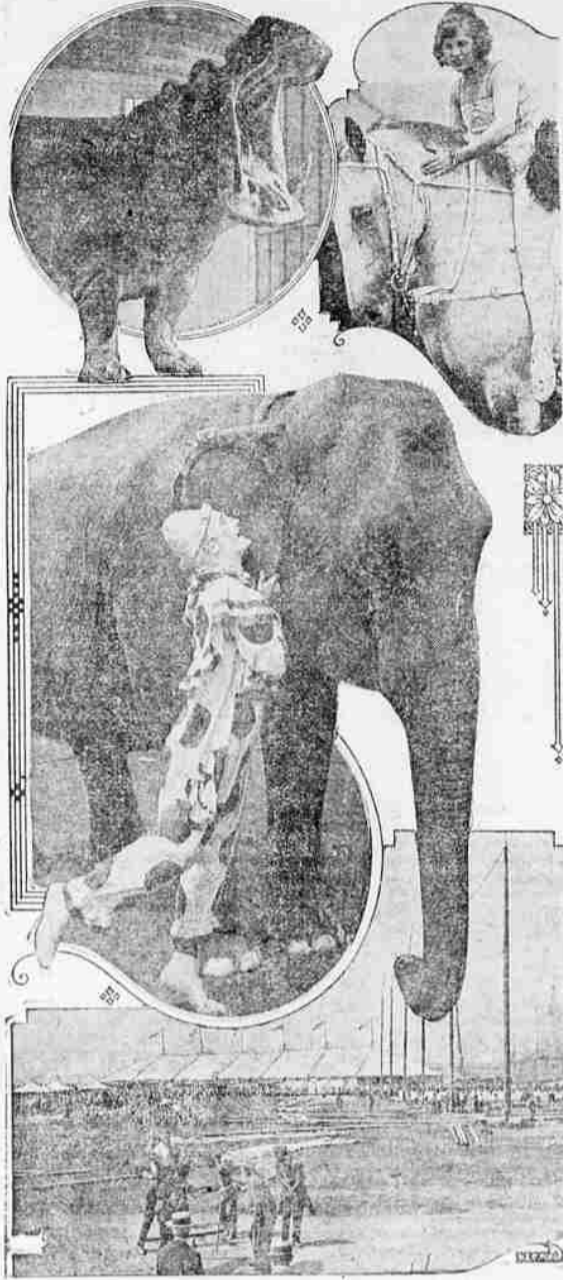


# Five Rings 'n Everything With Barnum-Ringling Circus Here Tomorrow

Five rings—count 'em! Dazzling and bewildering feats of superhuman daring by eight hundred men and women performers! Three hundred and fifty trained horses! A hundred double-length railroad cars, crammed with ten thousand wonders! Ninety-nine clowns—

Yes, you've guessed it. The Ringling Brothers and Barnum & Bailey greatest show on earth will be here tomorrow, coming at dawn from Portland. The tents will be pitched at High School Athletic Field. It's the world's first and only five-ring circus. Simply had to add two more to make room for all the new acts that came over from Europe last winter. Sort of a "double-deck" affair with two rings set on top the wooden staves and then taken off again to make way for the tumbler, the leaver that drive sure-enough autos or row boats, and the trained police dogs that climb walls and ride horses.

Everybody says there just never was such a circus before. More'n a dozen high-wire walkers all running and jumping and dancing at one time. And there's one, Collesmo the Great, they call him, who does somersaults forward and backward on a wire no larger than a piano string. There are leaping horses that clear the backs of six and eight of their fellows at a bound, acrobats that juggle humans while standing on stilts, and big aerial acts no end.

Speaking of stunts, the circus men were telling today about a clown band that wears stiffs all the time they're playing for the automobiles that do the "shimmy patrol." And that isn't all. No, siree! More'n forty trained elephants, twelve of them babies, big double menagerie and a hundred and fifty horses just in one act. That's called the "equine ballet."

Nope, no parade. Hasn't been one anywhere by this circus in five years.

In no season has the Ringling Brothers and Barnum & Bailey circus introduced so many new features and novelties. Here are some of them:

Groups of acrobats who juggle human beings while mounted on stilts. Black and brown bears that propel row boats and start, steer and stop power driven automobiles. Police dogs that climb perpendicular walls twenty feet high. Two men, in a display numbering fourteen of the world's greatest high-wire artists, who turn forward and backward somersaults on slender wires. A company of French poodles that, made up in perfect likeness to toy ponies, give exact imitations of the five troupes of performing horses. The latter appear simultaneously, this innovation being made possible by the use of five big, wooden rings. The introduction of two additional rings is among the several physical features that make the big show of 1925 different and bigger than at any time before.
