

SENATORS TAKE RAGGED SUNDAY CONTEST 11 TO 8

The Salem Senators hammered out a 11 to 8 victory over the Independence baseball nine here yesterday in a long drawn out game. The visitors drew first blood when they scored two runs to take the lead on Ashby's wildness. Ashby passed the first three men filling the bases. Edwards started to put Bishop in the box then but Ashby wanted to stay in and Edwards let him. The next man up singled and the bases were still loaded with one run across and no out. Schrank was caught off of second for the first out. Stolzenberg singled and Green tallied. Preston hit into a double play.

The Senators went out in order in their half of the first but scored seven runs in their part of the second. Keene first man up got a walk. Reinhart walked, Coleman got a fielder's choice while White tried to throw Keene out at third but all hands were safe and the bases loaded with no one out. Quisenberry singled and Keene scored. Edwards got a nice hit over second and Reinhart and Coleman tallied. Quisenberry went to third Bishop walked, sending Edwards to second, filling the bases again. Bouton sent a sacrifice fly to centerfield and Quisenberry scored. Proctor was safe on second when Stolzenberg dropped his fly. Edwards crossing the plate. Bishop scored on Green's error when he threw wild to second. Proctor also scored on the error and Maples going to third. Keene up for the second time of the inning flew out to left field. Reinhart fanned.

The visitors annexed another run in their part of the third. Green singled and stole second and scored a minute later on Preston's double. The Senators scored once in the fourth. Bouton singled and went to second when Maples walked. Keene singled and Bouton went to third and scored on Coleman's hit. The Independence nine scored two more runs in the fourth Hill was safe at second on Bouton's error. Ray doubled and Hill scored. Green doubled and Ray scored. In their half of the fifth the locals scored two runs. Quisenberry was safe on shortstop's error. Edwards went out at first. Quisenberry went to third on a passed ball. Bishop singled and Quisenberry scored. Bouton got a fielder's choice while Green threw Bishop out at second. Bouton started to steal and Schrank threw wild to second letting him go to third. Proctor singled and Bouton scored. Proctor went to third and Maples

to first on shortstop's error. Keene walked to fill the bases but Reinhart fanned to end the inning. Coleman got a hit in the sixth and went to second on Quisenberry's single. Edwards and Bishop flew out. Bouton doubled and Coleman scored. This ended the scoring for the Senators.

In the seventh the visitors got one more run when the visitors hit over the left field fence for a homer. They scored their final two in the ninth frame. Schrank singled. Stolzenberg flew out to Adolph who went in for Keene in the ninth inning. Preston hit his second homer of the game over the left field fence scoring Schrank ahead of him. White singled, Omar got a hit and White went to second. Baker, hitting for Fisher was safe at first on Adolph's error. The ball went to the stands and White tried to score, Adolph getting the ball in time to throw him out at the plate. O'Marra went to third on the play. Hill fanned to end the game.

The Senators were a little outclassed by Graham Sharkey in the driving exhibition although Schackman beat him in the first drive. Edwards is not sure who he will play next Sunday although he thinks that he can get Albany.

MUSCLE SHOALS POWER IS USED

Florence, Ala., Aug. 29.—(A. P.)—Muscle Shoals power was called into use today to relieve a shortage of electric power in South Atlantic states resulting from extended drought.

Responding to an appeal to states affected, the war department at Washington ordered one of the big generators at Wilson dam placed in operation. This was put into effect today, adding approximately 18,000 kilowatts to the power available and demonstrating the first concrete result of an expenditure of about \$51,000,000 by the federal government.

WOODMEN LIFE PLAN BIG DRIVE

Capital Camp No. 1 of the Pacific Woodmen Life association will hold a big get together meeting at their hall, 336 north Liberty street next Thursday evening when plans will be submitted for a big membership campaign that will terminate with a mammoth class initiation on the evening of October 3 when the camps from Portland, Dallas, Junction City and Eugene will join with the local camp in this big celebration. The officers and team from Portland putting on the work in full form.

The Pacific Woodmen Life association is making a rapid growth in Oregon since March seven camps have been instituted and there are several more in the making. During July only eighteen states produced more business than Oregon. The state headquarters are located at 315 U. S. National bank building, Salem, and it is the plan of F. A. Beard, state manager to place camps in all the principal cities just as quickly as possible.

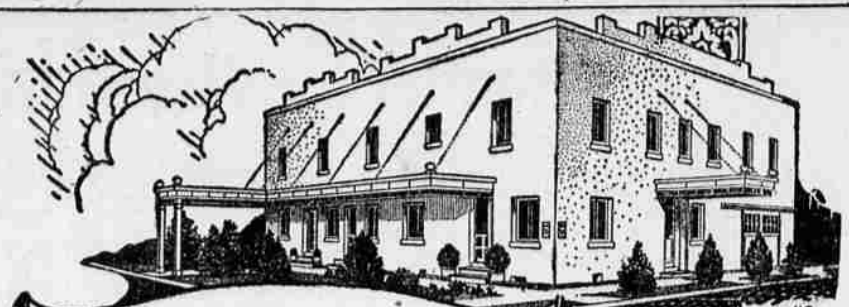
