

ROSEBURG BAND WILL LEAD AUTO STYLE PARADE

The Roseburg band, under the direction of A. T. Lawrence, will lead the parade of automobiles entered in the Oregon state motor style show, October 3, when they are driven through Salem to the fair grounds. It was announced by Mrs. Ella S. Wilson, secretary of the fair association, today.

There is a possibility of the show being given on two days instead of one, according to Miss Alice Hankinson, who is in charge of arrangements for the show. In the event that dealers wish to have the show on two days, Tuesday will be the other day selected, with the parade and review before the grandstand at the same hour as on Saturday. The actual judging of the cars, however, will not take place until Saturday afternoon.

Many local dealers have already announced their intention of entering various models of this year's cars, together with new fall models arriving from the east. The new models recently announced by the Ford Motor company will be displayed in the show, according to arrangements made with G. S. Lapham, factory representative from Portland, who was in Salem yesterday.

The cars will be driven by the most attractive and popular girls in Salem. Many of the dealers have already selected their drivers and others are endeavoring to find drivers who will assist them in winning prizes.

PHONE PETITION GRANTED

The public service commission yesterday issued an order granting a petition of certain citizens in the vicinity of Hillsboro for telephone connection with the Hillsboro exchange. The persons affected are Mrs. Earl L. Hobbs, Florence Kane, F. T. Kane, W. E. Barr, M. E. Barr, K. E. Goodin and R. E. Goodin.

An order was issued authorizing the Multnomah & Clackamas County Mutual Telephone company to furnish telephone exchange service through Graham to Troutdale, and authorizing the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph company to discontinue that service.

It is also ordered that the former company shall provide like or similar farmer service to subscribers who are now receiving farmer service through the Troutdale switchboard and shall within 30 days file with the commission a tariff setting out rates and regulations.

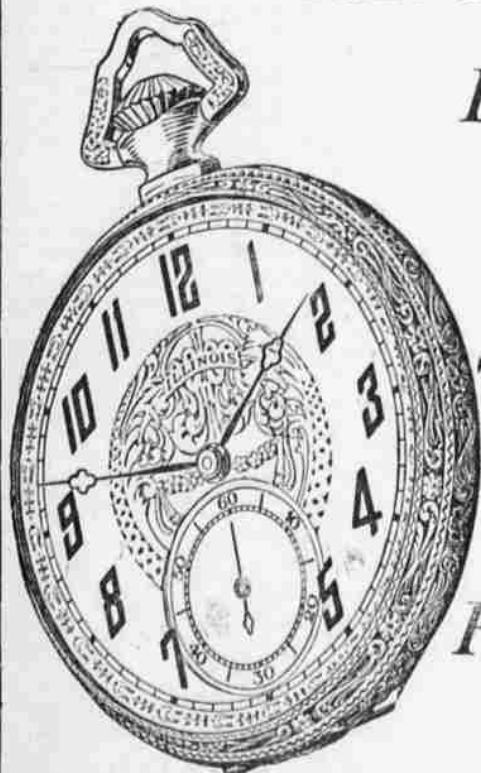
