

PRESIDENT TO FORCE MERGER OF RAIL LINES

Swampscott, Mass., Sept. 2.—(AP)—Legislation to force railroad consolidation after a period of seven years will be sought by the administration in the next session of congress.

Amendment of the Esch-Cummins act to this effect was agreed upon today at a conference between President Coolidge and Senator Watson, republican of Indiana assistant leader of the senate and chairman of the interstate commerce committee.

Senator Watson agreed with the president that approval of the Van Sweringen consolidation scheme pending before the interstate commerce commission would clear the way for numerous voluntary consolidations. They are anxious that voluntary groupings of railroads be brought about but think it time to force a consolidation by legislation after seven years of trial of the voluntary program.

In discussing the legislative program for the next session the president and Senator Watson also went into coal situation, the latter predicting that if an acute crisis arose under the present suspension of operations in the anthracite field the executive would take decisive action.

LOST SPANISH TRANSPORT SAFELY ANCHORS IN BAY

Melilla, Spanish Morocco, Sept. 2.—(AP)—The Spanish transport Espana Number 5 is safely at anchor in this harbor.

The Espana Number 5, is one of several transports which are at Melilla embarking troops to be carried to points designated by the Spanish high command.

BRICKLAYERS VIE FOR SPEED

Oklahoma City, Okla., Sept. 3.—The dancing marathons of two or three years ago may find a counterpart in the art of bricklaying. The claim of one James Brown of Missouri to the title of world's champion bricklayer is meeting with many challenges from this section of the southwest.

A news story under a Kansas City dateline recently told of Brown's laying 36,000 bricks in an eight-hour period. A week ago B. H. Johnson, brick specialist on the Edmund-Guthrie highway, laid over 50,000 brick in one day—and remarked that he ought to be fired if he couldn't put over 36,000 in place.

Now comes one Tony Glasco of Covington, Okla., with a claim that makes Brown look like a novice and even overshadowed Johnson. Glasco vows that he put 60,000 brick in place in one day recently, 8700 an hour or 145 a minute.

Equalling the record of Johnson is the claim of "Slim" Peterson of Arkansas City, Kan.

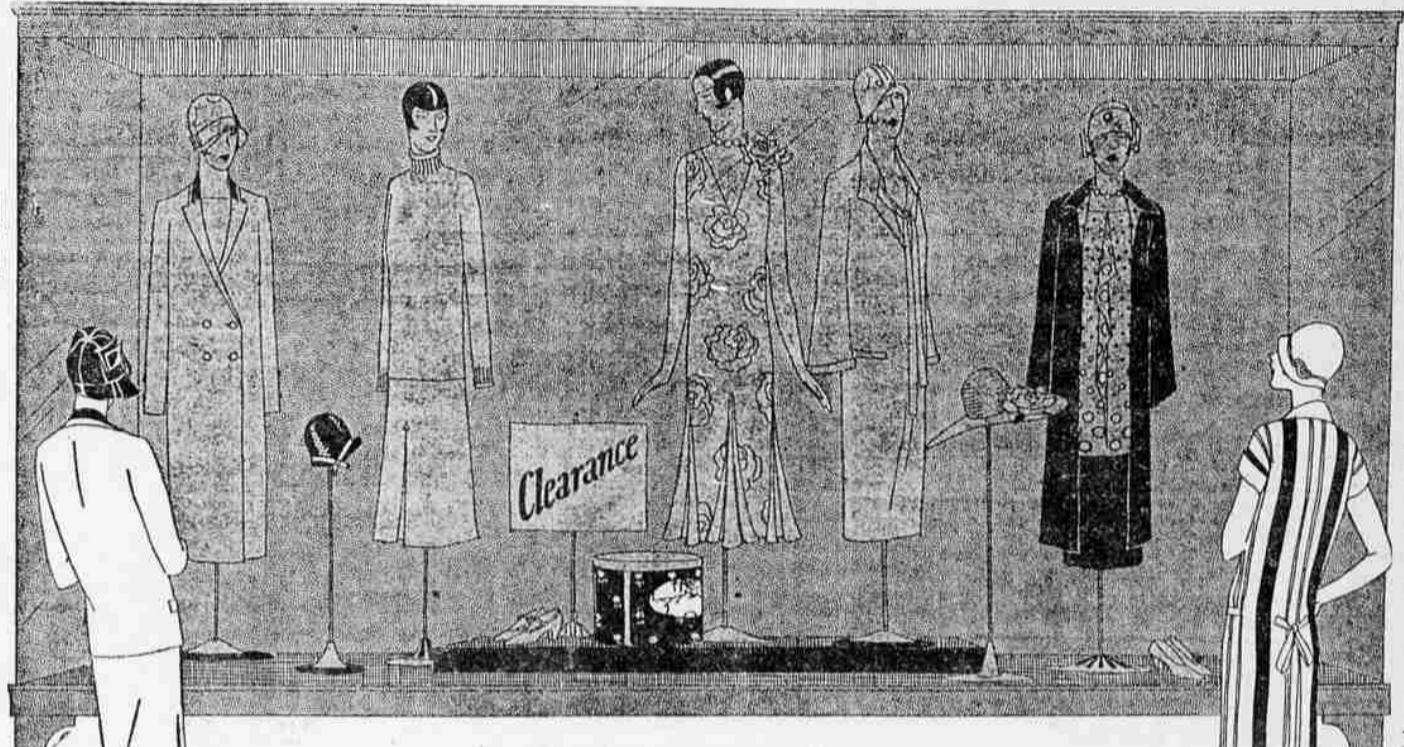
