

BOY FALLS THRU SKYLIGHT; HURTS ARE NOT SERIOUS

Theodore Chitty, aged 11, suffered severe cuts about the head and facial bruises when he fell 20 feet through a skylight into the Capitol barber shop, 264 State street. C. A. Wood, proprietor of the shop, who was working at the first chair at the time the incident took place, was slightly lamed in the back where young Chitty struck him in his precipitous entrance into the shop.

"I was just leaning over on account of the falling glass," said Wood this morning, "when the boy fell on my back." It is believed that if the boy had struck a few feet at either side and hit the corner of a chair, he would have been killed. Or if Wood had not happened to be exactly where he was, in the position he was, it is considered probable that a number of bones would have been broken.

As it was the youth bled profusely. He was carried out and attended to by a local doctor. Two stitches were taken in his leg.

Only one skylight was broken. The incident occurred at about 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon. He was walking along the roof of the building when the accident happened. The Chitty home is in the Capitol hotel, located at the building at the corner of State and Commercial streets, the barber shop being part of the same building.

ARMY OFFICER CONVICTED OF MURDERING WOMAN

Manila, P. I., Sept. 3.—(A. P.)—Lieutenant J. S. Thompson was today found guilty of the murder of Miss Audrey Burleigh, whom he shot to death in his automobile in April last, and was sentenced to be hanged.

Thompson was tried by court martial. His counsel at first entered a plea of insanity, but this was withdrawn yesterday and a plea of "guilty to voluntary manslaughter but not guilty of murder" was made on behalf of the prisoner. He is a son of Rev. J. Milton Thompson, pastor of the Russell Sage memorial church at Far Rockaway. He is 24 years of age.

BARBERS BOOST PORTLAND SCALE NO CHANGE HERE

Portland, Sept. 3.—The price of haircuts for members of both sexes was raised from fifty to sixty-five cents here yesterday, following a conference of master barbers. The price of a shave also was raised from 25 to 35 cents.

The barbers said the increase was necessary to meet the raise recently granted to journeymen barbers.

There is no immediate possibility that Salem barbers will raise their prices for work as have barbers in Portland. It was stated yesterday afternoon by Clarence Townsend, secretary of the local barbers' union, Portland barbers have increased the price for a haircut from 50 cents to 65 cents, and for a shave from 25 cents to 35 cents.

"There is no action of the kind impending here," said Townsend. "Conditions the way they are right now are perfectly satisfactory in every way. The barber is satisfied, the boss is satisfied and the public is satisfied."

The fact that there are five non-union barber shops operating in the city at the present time was said by Townsend to have no bearing on the situation.

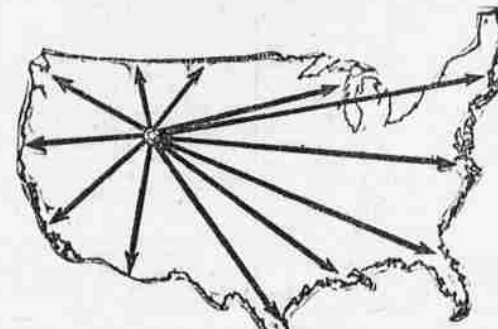

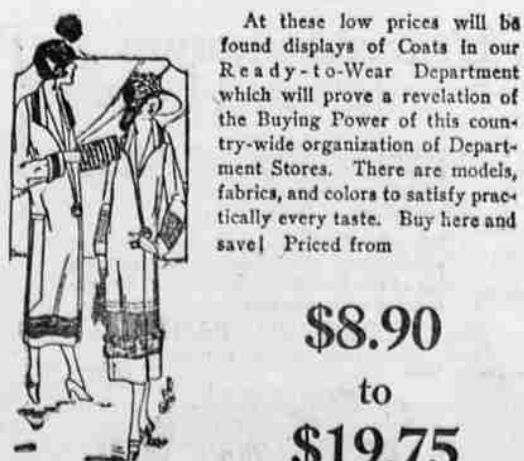
