

SENATORS TRIM TOLEDO AGAIN; RAIN ENDS GAME

The Salem Senators took the Toledo baseball nine into camp yesterday afternoon for the second time in as many days when they defeated them on the Oxford park diamond by a score of 2 to 1 in a five-inning game. The game was called at the end of the fifth frame on account of rain which fell in torrents as the last man went out.

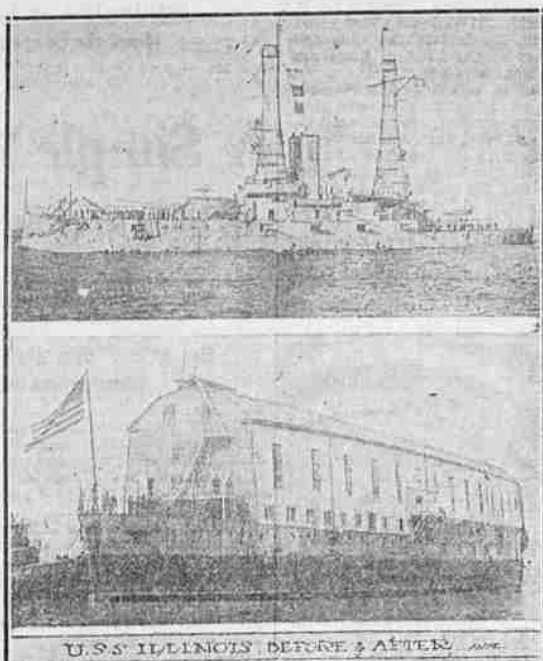
The Toledo nine took the lead when they scored one run on a homer by Brooks. Neither side scored in the first frame although both teams had men on base but were unable to connect with the necessary hits. Brooks first man at bat in the second hit the ball over the right field fence. Stapleton flew out to Quisenberry. Spriggs went out to Houston on a line drive which Houston was able to stop with a snatching catch. Copeland was hit by a pitched ball but Beams flew out to Edwards. This was the end of the visitors scoring.

All three of the Senators went out in order in their half of the second. The fourth inning proved to be disastrous to the Toledo team when the Senators crossed the plate twice to tie and take the lead which they were able to hold until Jupiter Pivius came and helped them out. Keene, first man up in the fourth, was issued a pass to first. Keene stole second and went to third on a pass ball. Reinhart walked. Quisenberry went out, Copeland to King. Schackman flew out to right field and Keene crossed the plate with the tying run after the catch. Edwards got a single between third and short and scored Reinhart with the winning run. Keene went into run for Edwards but Ashby went out at first.

The Toledo team tried hard in their half of the fifth to come from behind but were unable to score due to Quinn's bunched play. Beams started over second base. Quinn hit to Maples who tried to get Beams at second but Proctor dropped the ball and all were safe. Beams was caught off of second. Ashby to Proctor. King fled out to Schackman. Strickmeter got a double to centerfield and Quinn went to third. Robbins, a dangerous hitter, was at bat and Edwards was not going to let him repeat his feat of two homers yesterday. Maples caught Quinn off of third base flat footed with the hidden ball trick and the Senators were winners.

By virtue of their win for the second time the Senators are claimants of the state semi-pro championship. The Senators have had one of the best teams in years under the management of Edwards who have won over some of the strongest teams in the state. They have taken victories from Fort of Portland, winners of the city championship and leaders in the tournament which is being held in Portland. They have two wins and no losses checked up to their credit and were well on their way to the Portland championship. They have also taken a victory from the Cyclops, winners of the Greater Portland league. The Cyclops nine finished their league season without a loss but are trailing along in the cellar with two losses and no wins in the Portland championship series. It was a besting these two champions and the Senators are winners of the Interstate pennant. What other team can rightfully claim the state title is the question of Edwards.
