

GOLFERS PLAY ALDERWOOD AT LATTER'S GROUNDS

Sixteen-men teams representing the Illihee Country club golf team and the Alderwood club, of Portland, will line up against each other next Sunday morning on the Alderwood links in the first half of a home and home series for the two clubs. FOUR OPINIONS UPON NEW LAWS BY VAN WINKLE

Only personal and real property taxes shall be considered by the state in remitting to the city of Astoria its taxes under the fire relief act passed by the state legislature in 1923, according to an opinion of the attorney general's office. The inquiry was made by the city manager who contended that gasoline, inheritance, corporation and other similar taxes should be included.

An opinion was written yesterday, in reply to an inquiry by Governor Pierce, holding that public officials who are accused of

malfeasance in office or corruption may be proceeded against under existing special laws, and are not subject to immunity although there are constitutional provisions prohibiting their impeachment.

Another opinion yesterday holds that when union high school districts have neglected to make a tax levy for maintenance it is the duty of the county courts to make the levy. Several county courts submitted the question to the attorney general.

Taxpayers affected by the act of the 1925 legislature providing for the remission of penalties, interest and costs on delinquent taxes of the years 1921, 1922 and 1923 may recover such penalties, interest and costs if paid through error after the new law became effective, according to another opinion.

PENSION FUND IS SOUGHT FOR FIREMEN HERE

Means for creating a city pension fund for the benefit of aged retired employees will be considered as a result of Fire Chief Harry Hutton appearing before the city council last night and asking the city, if possible under existing ordinances, to grant a pension to Peter Phillips, who for 28 years has been in the employ of the fire department. He suggested that at least \$50 a month should be granted.

The council was favorably disposed to the suggestion and Alderman Patton moved that a warrant for \$50 be drawn in Mr. Phillips' favor, but action on this was deferred for two weeks for further investigation of ways and means for granting pensions. Alderman Dancy urged that steps be taken to create a pension fund.

Mr. Phillips first entered the service of the fire department in 1897.

"He has been working for me for a long time," said Chief Hutton. "First I worked for him. I worked for him in Illinois."

LONG HERALDED DRIVE AGAINST RIFFS LAUNCHED

Paris, Sept. 9.—(AP)—The long heralded Franco-Spanish offensive against Abd-el-Krim's Riffian tribesmen and their allies has begun and soon will be in full swing, it was said in official quarters today.

The Spaniards after their successful landing on the shores of Alhucemas bay yesterday are marching on Ajdir to the south.

Franco-Spanish forces numbering between 150,000 and 200,000 already are or shortly will begin attacking Tetuan in the northern section of the Riff country and She-Shuan further to the south.

The Spaniards from the north are to launch a heavy assault around Tetuan, while the French army from the south clears the She-Shuan territory.

Another French army meanwhile is to advance from the south toward Ajdir, Abd-el-Krim's capital.

These simultaneous and closely coordinated operations are designed to exert pressure against the Riffians from all sides in an effort to crush them.

CAR PARKING ON SCHOOL GROUND TO BE RESERVED

At the next circus which is held in Salem, students of Parleth Junior high school may go into the auto parking business, as a result of the question being brought up at the meeting of the Salem school board last night. At

the recent circus held here, it developed, an outsider, traveling with the circus, rented the Parleth grounds from the school district for the purpose of renting parking space, which was greatly in demand in the vicinity of the tent at the time the show was staged. The man took in something over \$20, according to his report, of which the school district received \$6.50.

Last night it was proposed by William Gahldorf, member of the board, that students at the school rent parking space near the grounds themselves, using the money to pay for equipment of the school stage and for other purposes. The idea met with general approval by board members, although no definite action was taken.

Agitation was started in favor of the purchase of at least one bookkeeping machine, the statement being made that the system of bookkeeping now taught in schools is rapidly becoming antiquated, all banks and most up to date business houses using a machine. It was declared that under present conditions a graduate of the local high school, who takes the bookkeeping course there, is not qualified to fill a position as bookkeeper in an up to date establishment without further training.

Two janitors were elected last night. O. E. Hogue was chosen to the position at Highland school, Mr. McMillan was selected to work at the senior high school.

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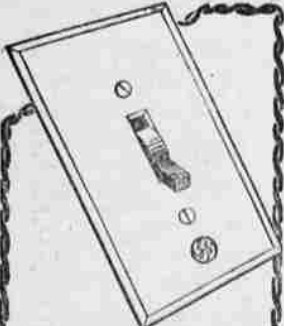
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
