

HEALTH STAFF TO ATTEND MEET HERE SATURDAY

Dr. Walter Brown, head of the Marion county child health demonstration, and his entire staff of 29 will be present at the meeting at the chamber of commerce here Saturday, when representative citizens from all parts of the county will be present. It is expected that all phases of the work of the demonstration will come up.

There are 16,000 school children in the county under the last census, of which practically 6000 are in the Salem district.

Under plans recently arranged through the demonstration every one of the ten schools in Salem will be visited daily by a nurse employed and paid by the demonstration and the physical condition of every child will be ascertained. The same service will also be available to the various other schools of the county.

It is stated that at the present time there are three other counties in the United States where the Commonwealth fund program is at about the same stage that it is here. The three other counties are at Fargo, N. D., Athens, Ga., and Murphysboro, Tenn. Service is being conducted there under the same arrangements as here.

NO MORE BODIES FOUND IN WENATCHEE DEBRIS

Wenatchee, Wn., Sept. 10.—No more bodies have been found in the debris at the Great Northern terminal at Apple Yard, swept by a flood resulting from a cloud-burst in the mountains on Saturday. It was announced today. Three steam shovels and a large crew of men are working night and day to clear up the wreckage. Four persons are known to be missing.

The work of clearing the debris was today taken over by the railroad and Chelan county as the result of an agreement reached with the county commissioners. The county has appropriated \$1500 for the work, providing for a crew of 60 men.

BARBER SHOP BALKS AT 65 CENT HAIR CUTS

Portland, Sept. 10.—One downtown barber shop yesterday broke with the barbers' union and refused to adopt a new scale of prices advancing hair cuts from 50 cents to 65 cents, and shaves from 25 to 35 cents. The new rates were adopted under an agreement between the master barbers and the barbers' union this week. Non-union men were employed in the dissenting barbershop.

Master barbers will meet tonight to consider the defection of this barber shop from the agreement.

Scenes That Thrilled Nation are Re-Enacted In Spectacular Film

Scenes which thrilled not only the nation but the world, during the building of the first transcontinental railroad in the early sixties, have been re-enacted for this generation in the William Fox super special production "The Iron Horse," starring "Smiling George" O'Brien and Madge Bellamy.

One of the most dramatic scenes during the actual construction and now in the picture, was the building of ten miles of track in a day, which still stands as the world's record.

William M. Thayer's "Marvels

of the New West," contains the following account of the scene has been so faithfully presented on the screen:

"Four miles west of Promontory Point, Utah, is a sign board, on which is inscribed:

"TEN MILES IN ONE DAY"

"Ten miles further west is another board bearing the same inscription and the explanation of this—the track between those two sign boards was laid in one day—more track than was ever laid in a day before or since. The cause of this extra effort was the rivalry created between the Central Pacific working gang west of Promontory and the Union working force east of that point. The Central gang boasted that they could lay more track in a day than the Union. The track layers accepted the challenge and laid six miles in one day. Then the Central gang announced that they would lay ten miles of track in one day, which the officers of the Union declared could not be done. Vice-President Durant bet \$10,000 that it could not be done. Charles Crocker of the Central Pacific taking the other end of the wager.

"The Central men proposed to establish their claim on the 29th day of April when there was only 14 miles of track to be laid, to connect with the Union at Promontory Point. Every necessary arrangement was made and on the appointed day, in the presence of the officers of the road and a committee from the Union, the work was accomplished."

EARL TO LOSE U. S. CITIZENSHIP

Washington, Sept. 10.—(AP)—Oliver Henry Wallop, who has become Earl of Portsmouth as a result of the death of his brother, is practically certain to lose the American citizenship he now holds by naturalization when he accepts the British title.
