

TOLEDO DROPS THIRD STRAIGHT TO LOCAL CREW

The Salem Senators defeated the Toledo baseball nine yesterday afternoon before a large crowd in a game played at Albany by a score of 6 to 3. The victory was the third straight over the "Clam Diggers," who claimed that the Senators were afraid to play them.

In the first game the Senators were victorious by a score of 8 to 4. The locals took the second game by a 2 to 1 score after five innings of play. The game was called at that time on account of rain. The Toledo team then challenged the locals to a third game to be played on a neutral diamond and Albany was selected. The Toledo team claimed that the Senators had robbed them of the second game when the umpire called a man out on third on a hidden ball trick before the ball had returned to the pitcher after "time out" had been called. Each side put up a purse of \$250 to make up a purse of \$500 to go to the winner, besides playing on a 60-40 basis.

The crowd who witnessed the game was the largest to see the Senators this year when they exceeded 1500 people. Salem played excellent ball throughout the game and were credited with a clean sheet in the error column. Bouton, Maples and Adolph proved to be too strong a combination for the Toledo team by pulling some brilliant plays that kept the "Clam Diggers" off of the bases. Edwards also played a nice game.

Stapleton, receiving for Toledo and Strickmeyer, hurler, featured the playing of Toledo with three hits each. Beamis was knocked out of the box in the third inning by the Senator slugger, although his removal was aided by three Toledo errors. The Senators scored three runs in the first inning, coupled with several walks and hits combined.

A feature of the Salem hitting was a two-base blow by "Frisco" Edwards, crippled catcher for the locals. Edwards has had to knock a home run nearly every time he has reached first base safely. The two-base hit was nearly as much of a surprise to him as it was to the fans and it seemed queer to see him hobbling down to second, the first time this year. The hit would have been good to run triple had any one else hit it.

The Senators outplayed the Toledo nine in every department and

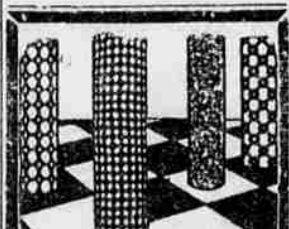
