JURY OUT NINE HOURS RETURNS DEATH VERDICT

Chicago, Sept. 17.—(AP)—Joseph Holmes and Jack Woods, two of five robbers who a few weeks ago invaded the fashionable Drake hotel and staged a pistol battle in an attempted holdup, were convicted by a jury of the murder of Frank B. Rodney, hotel cashier, and given the death penalty. The jury deliberated for more than nine hours until nearly dawn today and several times were ducked at nine to three and 10 to 2 for a hanging verdict, the minority holding out for life imprisonment on the grounds that the pair were insane. The defense relied on an insanity plea and in the closing arguments declared there were many instances in which persons accused of murder had pleaded guilty and been sentenced only to life imprisonment. CHEMAWA SQUAD SENDS HOPES OF INDIANS UPWARD

CHEMAWA, Sept. 17.—Prospects for a winning football eleven for the 1925 season appear to be the brightest for several years, according to the announcement made last evening by George Bent, manager of the Chemawa Indians. The last really good team that the Indians had was in 1920 and 1921 when the Nix and Colby brothers, Samson and several others were in the Chemawa lineup. Those men were all big and husky but since their leaving the Indians have had smaller players each year which has made it exceedingly difficult to present a winning team. If the men now out are not forced out of the game on account of injuries the Indians will have their biggest team they have had in several seasons. The Indians have made good showings in basketball, baseball and track but have been decidedly weak on the gridiron. This year they are in hopes of changing things around. Falling on the ball, tackling the dummy and other things that go with the preparation has been the program for the last two weeks at the school and when they open their season the Indians will have the advantage of nearly two weeks practice over their opponents. The Redskins have had only a few minutes of scrimmage so far but expect to have their first touch of fire when they have a game with the second team next Saturday. Thirty-one men are now out for the squad. Mr. Bent announced. Six letters are back and several new arrivals are expected to add considerable strength. Coquille Thompson is a heavy 135 pounder and is expected to be in full and he is expected to fill that position to great advantage. Thompson is a new man in the lineup. Jimmy Lane is also a new man and expected to be a whirlwind. The backfield will be exceptionally strong this year and the line will be no weakling either although if there is any weak spot in the team it will be on the line. The men who are out for positions are Royal Holst and Sedan Thomas for center. Thomas was first string center last year and will more than likely be back at his old position when the whistle blows Roy Peratrovich, Willie Skinnay, Wallace Eagle, Arthur Bruce, Edwards Walker, Richard O'Brien, Eddie Oliver, Oscar Taylor, Thomas Bad Bear, guards; Ole Strom, a clever man from the team of last year, Francis Ross, Sam Nergusson, Peter Rasmussen, and Joe Webster are out for tackle.

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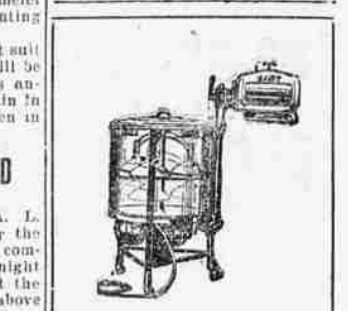
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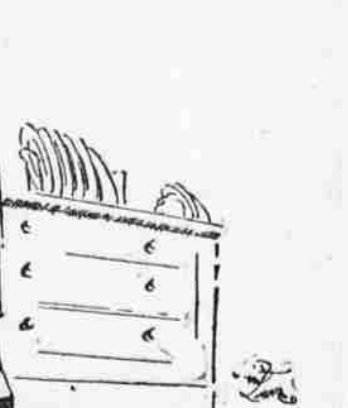
