

CLOSE DECISION ROBS SENATORS OF OPPORTUNITY

OPERA DIRECTOR DEFENDANT IN ASSAULT CASE

New York, Sept. 19.—(A. P.)—Arraigned before Magistrate Jean Norris, the only woman police court judge in the city, Alberto Baccolini, artistic director and conductor of the Boston civic opera company, today was held in \$1,000 bail for further hearing October 2 on a charge of felonious assault which resulted from a backstage fight last night in the Manhattan opera house. The trouble followed a quarrel over payment of the chorus appearing in Bellini's "Norma."

Frank Schurman, walking delegate of the grand opera choral alliance, and complainant against Baccolini, did not appear in court. Magistrate Norris was told that one of Schurman's ears was nearly severed when he was knocked into an ash can by Baccolini.

Baccolini's lawyer explained that when Schurman asked Baccolini about payments for the chorus he was referred to a representative of the opera company. Thereupon, Schurman called him a liar and struck him. Baccolini

struck back. The entire company, stage hands and orchestra were soon involved in the fracas.


