

BOOSTER CLUBS TO COMPETE FOR PRIZES AT FAIR

Competition for prizes will be engaged in on Friday of state fair week by booster organizations of various cities that are members of the State Hospitality club, according to a letter received by J. H. Wilson, secretary of the state fair board, from M. S. Taylor of North Bend, president of the club.

The Salem Cherrians, members of the state organization, will not compete for prizes, leaving this to the visiting clubs but the Cherrians will exhibit a drill. The Cherrians, however, are preparing for a Cherrian registration booth where the members of the visiting clubs will leave their names and from where ribbon badges will be distributed to the ladies of the visiting clubs. A committee composed of Harry Levy, chairman, Bert Ford and I. R. Smith, is arranging for this.

The first prize cup will be offered to that organization which puts on the most spectacular stunt in the stadium at night regardless of kind or character of the stunt. The second cup will be offered for that organization whose parading and stunts best advertise the locality from which they hail. In other words, to the organization which does the best piece of advertising throughout the day for its locality. The third cup will be offered to that organization which has the largest ratio of its active members at the fair in proportion to the number of miles traveled in order to reach the fair.

Mr. Taylor expects to arrive in Salem a day or two in advance of hospitality day according to present plans and will be glad to aid in making final arrangements for

BOY LOSES ARM IN CUTTER; DIES

Fried Koster, 21, was instantly killed yesterday when his arm was torn completely off at the shoulder by a belt on an engine cutter and his head was smashed against the machine. The accident occurred shortly before noon yesterday on the Peter Koster farm, one mile south of Monitor. Koster and his sons were filling the farm silo when the belt on the machine caught and young Koster attempted to fix it without stopping the engine.

Death was instantaneous. Funeral arrangements have not been made. Surviving are the parents, Mr. and Mrs. Peter Koster and several brothers and sisters.

LIBEL CHARGE AGAINST DAVEY IS DISMISSED

The charge of criminal libel lodged against Robert E. Davey, formerly of Salem, now editor of the Journal at Newport, has been dismissed, says information from that place.

The case took an unexpected turn in the justice court Tuesday when Joe Minton, attorney for Davey, called for the deposition on which the warrant for Davey's arrest was issued. It was found that no deposition had been made, although the law requires it. On that ground Minton moved for dismissal, and Justice of the Peace Black could not do otherwise than grant the motion.

Davey was accused of libeling a city official by publication of a

complaint that had been filed against the official.

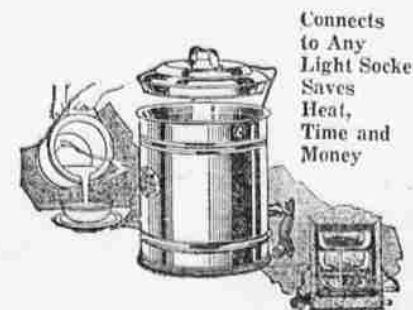
