KING SEEKS TO POSTPONE MURRAY TRIAL

Attorney For Convicts Says Warden Refused Permission To Examine Prison.

Will R. King, attorney for Tom Murray, who was scheduled for trial in circuit court here next Monday morning for the alleged murder of Guards Milt Holman and James Sweeney during the break of Murray, Ellsworth Kelley and James Willos from the state prison August 12, this afternoon filed motion with Judge Percy R. Kelly asking postponement of the trial until the "first day of the December term of this year, or such further time as the court may deem suitable."

He further charges that he had not been allowed to interview or consult with Murray, except through locked steel doors. Warden Dalrymple is also accused of refusing to allow delivery of letters addressed to King as counsel for Murray from other prisoners, and an order is asked compelling the warden to surrender all such letters to King.
