

HERMAN-LEWIS BATTLE GOES 10 ROUNDS TO DRAW

Cal Herman, Salt Lake fighter and Frankie Lewis of Salem fought ten rounds to a draw last night in the opening boxing card of the season. Herman tipped the scales at 145 and Lewis at 139. The fight was even all the way through with neither battler having much advantage. Herman did most of the leading with Lewis wanting to land a go hard blow. Not once did Lewis back up but he was unable to find the clever little Salt Lake where he expected him to be.

Lewis landed one good hard blow in the third round but Herman came right back. Herman was lots faster than the Indian fighter although he lacked the wallop that Lewis carries. Lewis is not slow by any means and is able to step around right lively but Herman had the best of this department. Lewis did not seem to be in as good condition as in several of his former fights. He appeared to have only his left hand in the first few rounds but got better as the fight progressed. He made him miss repeatedly.

In the seventh round the Salt Lake called for Lewis to get in and fight. The eighth round started out rather snappy but neither side got the best of it. The last two rounds were about even and neither man was taking a chance of getting knocked down with a chance of getting a slight decision. 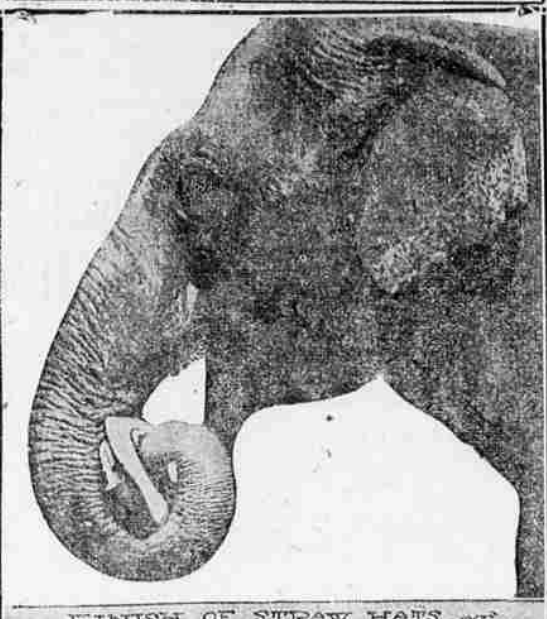
Red Martin of Salem and Battling Kendall of Salem fought four

Washington, Oct. 1.—(A. P.)—The irrigation development of the west will go forward without opinion with understanding and co-operation by congress and local interests, Commissioner Mead of the bureau of reclamation of the interior department declared today in a statement.

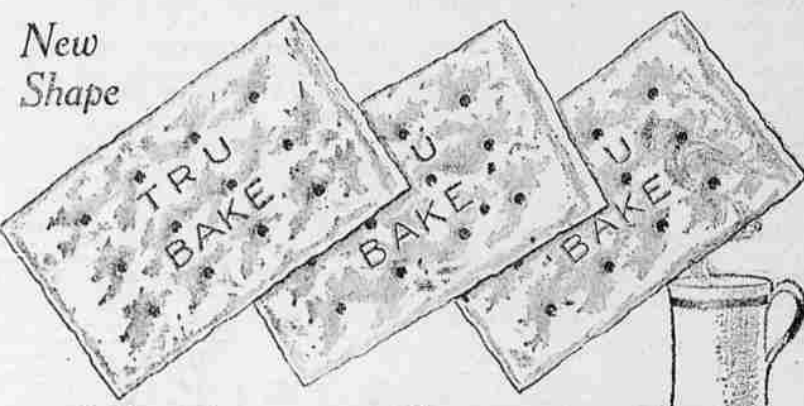
