GUARDS FIRED FIRST SHOTS SAYS CONVICT

Tom Murray Takes Stand In Own Defense; Court Rulings Favor Defense In Three Instances.

Tom Murray, 22-year-old convict on trial for the murder of Guard John Sweeney in the prison break of August 12, admitted on the stand this morning that he fired a shot from a 2-20 revolver from the oak tree in the front yard of the prison at Guard Sweeney in lower No. 1, the shot which the state contends killed the guard.

Murray First Witness - Murray was the first witness for the defense, and his story of the escape and flight varied little from the accounts told previously by witnesses for the state, except that he claimed that the first shots were fired by the guards on tower No. 1 into the turnkey's office where he and Oregon Jones were sitting at the arsenal.

DEFENSE SCORES THIRTY
