

### CHERRIANS NEED NEW MEMBERS TO FILL RANKS

With the Cherrians wanting from 15 to 20 new members, with a number not attending meetings or responding to calls, King Bing J. C. Perry, King Bing, an auto-crat of Salem's marching club, has issued a call for a luncheon Tuesday evening at the chamber of commerce for 5:30 o'clock, when it will be determined what is going to be done about it.

The question also will be threshed out whether the motto of the organization "Once a Cherrian, Always a Cherrian," is going to remain in effect. The custom has been for super-annuated Cherrians, who for one reason or another dropped out of the activities of the club, to become Dukes of the Manor, and remain affiliated in an honorary capacity. Some of them have failed to do this, and whether it will be enforced will be discussed at the meeting.

In addition it will be determined whether the Cherrians will outline a winter program or remain in hibernation until next Memorial day.

Other important matters are to come up, and in consequence the king has put all of the majesty of his office behind the call and is demanding full attendance.

### PACIFIC HIGHWAY IN CALIFORNIA REOPENED

Sacramento, Cal., Oct. 13.—(R.)—Construction work now under way on the Pacific highway in the Sacramento canyon between Hadling and Dunsmuir has progressed to a point where the state highway is now open to traffic for a period of 24 hours daily. This announcement was made here today by State Highway Engineer H. M. Morton, who stated that the contract with the Nevada Contracting company where the widening and straightening of the highway between Halfway creek and Dog creek is now more than half completed.

Work remaining to be done is largely off the present right of way and for that reason there will

be little interference with traffic from now on until the completion of the work.

Closing restrictions are therefore removed and the highway will now be open throughout the 24 hours of each day.

### MINK CAUGHT IN CHICKEN YARD

Silverton, Or., Oct. 13.—(Special.)—The chicken thief which has been playing so much havoc in the poultry pens on Paradise road during the past few days was brought to the ground Sunday when Mrs. G. Hattberg went a-trapping. A mink was the catch. If this mink was lonely fellow or if he had companions poultry owners in the neighborhood are waiting to discover.

During the past week a number of hens have been found dead in the poultry yards. At first it was thought that dogs were doing the damage. A watch was kept and a mink was discovered in the act Sunday morning. A short time after the discovery, the culprit was a captive. Reports from two poultry owners alone Sunday morning showed a loss of 29 hens Saturday night.

### ASK INCREASE IN BUDGET FOR FIRE FIGHTERS

An allowance for the Salem fire department sufficient to provide additional equipment and housing facilities is asked in the preliminary estimate that has been made by Fire Chief Hutton and Alderman W. H. Dancy, chairman of the fire and water committee of the council. The tentative amount asked is \$59,130, which is an increase of \$17,101 over that made last year for 1925.

Additional salaries that are contemplated accounts for most of the increase asked, four additional men being asked by Mr. Dancy. This brings the amount wanted for salaries up to \$55,060, as against \$37,960 for the present year.

Dancy also asks that provision be made for a one-story hollow tile building on city property on East Ferry street, estimated to cost \$5,000. This would house a pumper and a chemical engine. Chief Hutton also wants additional combination pumps for North

and South Salem and the installation of a fire alarm system of 15 or 20 boxes. For the maintenance of the present station \$4,075 is asked.

Dancy estimates that the water department will need \$7,501 of which \$6,300 would go for water to supply hydrants. Fifteen new hydrants are held necessary, and these would cost an estimated \$1,201.

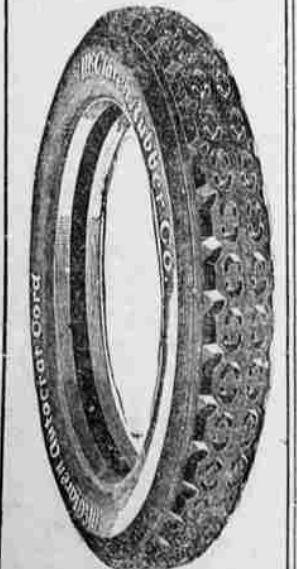
