

### BEAUTY SHOP GIRL SOUGHT IN EUREKA MURDER

Eureka, Cal., Oct. 14.—Miss Carmen Wagner, 18, friend of beauty shop proprietor, missing since the bullet-punctured body of Ivory Sweet was found beside his automobile, was being hunted today by poses in the hills of four counties on the northern California coast.

The motive for Sweet's death was not known to the authorities, the only purpose of the search for Miss Wagner being based on the belief that she was kidnapped after Sweet was shot.

Sweet was found beside his parked automobile in front of a ranch house near Fortune, a town south of here. Reports obtained by the authorities said that Miss Wagner was a companion of Sweet's on a hunting trip to the mountains which started on last Thursday. Other persons who joined in the hunting expedition have not been named by the sheriff.

The search at daybreak today was based on the hope that Miss Wagner might be found alive, but fears expressed that she might be the victim of the supposed abductor's bullets.

Miss Wagner was seen here on Friday night. She visited a beauty parlor here and had a friend dress her hair. She discussed the hunting trip and said she was going with Sweet and a married couple.

### GARAGE BURNS AT CORVALLIS

Corvallis, Oct. 14.—Fire broke out this afternoon in the Corvallis garage as the result of what was thought to be a gasoline explosion in a car just driven in for repair. The flames spread so rapidly the employees escaped from the building through the blinding smoke with difficulty. Everything burnable inside the building was consumed by the flames, including many cars in storage and some new ones.

Many of the stored cars had no insurance and the loss is estimated at \$20,000. The garage belonged to Wickham, Jenkins & Evans, dealers in the Nash and Oldsmobile cars.

### FAMOUS DRAMA "LIGHTNIN" AT HEILIG TONIGHT

"Lightnin'" the most famous play and the biggest success in the history of the American stage, will be seen here at last, being booked at the Heilig theater tonight.

Written by Winchell Smith and Frank Bacon, "Lightnin'" ran up a total of almost 1300 performances at the Gaiety theater, New York; over 600 performances at the Blackstone in Chicago, and comes here direct from its sensational run of eighteen weeks at the Capitol theater, San Francisco, with Thomas Jefferson, who was chosen by the late Frank Bacon himself just before his death, in the role for which Bacon succeeded him to be his logical successor.

"Lightnin'" has the west for its setting, and gains its title from its leading character, Lightnin' Bill Jones, so-called because he is the antithesis of speed. All in all, he is as lovable an old liar as could be conceived.

But Lightnin' isn't really had at heart, and he has a healthy respect for "Mother", as he calls his wife. He talks at signing a deed.

however, that will rob her of the little hotel which is the mecca for unhappy wives seeking a Reno divorce, and when she tells him that he will have to do as she says or get out, he walks off with his hat and his bottle and goes to the old soldier's home. Nothing is heard of him for six months, when he comes back to appear as a witness in a lawsuit, only to find that he himself is being sued for divorce. One of the best scenes in "Lightnin'" develops when Lightnin' acts as his own counsel and, though being coached by a young lawyer friend, assumes an air of great legal learning. In the end, he not only wins "Mother" back, but he "fixes" everything else in a way that is highly amusing and satisfying to the audience. Not since the days of Jefferson's Rip Van Winkle has the stage witnessed such a sympathetic character as Lightnin'. Audiences alternately weep and

laugh with the eccentric old fellow who is so human and lovable, even in his faults.

The same splendid case which was identified with "Lightnin'" during the long New York, Chicago and Boston engagements will be seen here intact, including as it does such well known players as Mrs. Frank Bacon, Beatie Bacon, Frank Thornton, Myles McCarthy, Jack Marvin, Thos. Jefferson, Felix Haney, Margt. Miller, Robt. Lowe, James Worsley, Ethan Allen, Nellie Keller, Wm. Wagner, Genevieve Lyle and many others.
