

WOODWARD TO FIGHT JEWETT NEXT WEDNESDAY

Ernie Woodward of Portland and Joe Jewett of Seattle are scheduled to fight the ten-round main event at the armory in the second boxing show of the season next Wednesday night. Harry Plant, matchmaker, was in Portland yesterday to sign the fighters.

Plant is making every effort to guarantee the fight fans their money's worth. As an added effort he will issue two tickets to the purchaser. One will admit him to the fight and the other he will keep. If, for any reason the fighters do not mix it up and try to stall the boxers will be thrown out and the other ticket will allow them a 75-cent reduction on their ticket to the next fight. Besides this the fighters will forfeit a \$50 guarantee and lose their money for the fight. It this doesn't make them fight nothing will, Plant said. The fans ought to be satisfied that Plant is trying to give them the best shows that have been here.

Russell Green and Shadow Grete both of Salem are to meet in the six-round semi-windup. Both of these fighters are well known in Salem and the battle ought to be good. Russ can hit hard and often as can Grete, so the fight will very likely be just the kind the fans want.

A special four-round preliminary between Jimmy Fargo of Salem and Fox of Independence has also been scheduled by Plant. Other fast preliminaries will be arranged later by Plant.

Ernie Woodward is a class fighter but he will have a tough customer in Joe Jewett. Jewett has knocked out seven in the 25 bouts, he has had. Jewett is 23 years old and is a mighty fast stepper. Burleson of McMinnville, Johnny Rose of Chicago, Jimmy Gibbs, Johnny Carlson have all hit the canvas when meeting Jewett. Jewett also knocked out Flash Kelley, Dummy Holling and Billy Welch in two rounds each.

"LIGHTNIN" BEST PLAY SEEN HERE IN PAST YEARS

"Lightnin'" Winchell Smith's and Frank Bacon's play proved to be one of the best plays yet seen in Salem when it appeared at the Hellig theater last night in the farewell tour of the play. It is declared to have broken all records in New York and Chicago and the Salem people who saw the play last night may be sure that there is a reason for its long record of runs in the two cities. The audience was kept in smiles and laughs during the whole show with the laughs coming so often that the people were unable to get them all.

Bessie Bacon as Margaret Davis and Thomas Jefferson as Lightnin' Bill Jones were the entire show. Mrs. Davis with her disgusting voice and the conceit of Lightnin' Bill were simply too funny for words. The play takes place in California and Nevada where Lightnin' Bill's wife owns a hotel which happens to be divided in two states. Half of it on the California side and the other half on the Nevada side. For that reason it is called the Calivada. The California side was neglected but the Nevada side was always full with ladies intending to get a divorce.

Mrs. Jones makes efforts to sell the hotel and retire for good. John Marvin a student of law is accused of taking some timber off of

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some property that formerly belonged to him but had been swindled out of him by the railroad company. The law student happens to find out that the purchasers of the hotel are the same who cheated him out of his property, and that they are to pay worthless stock for the hotel. Lightnin' Bill, his friend promises not to sign the deed until Marvin tells him to. Mr. Jones is bunked into trying for a divorce so that she will have clear title to sign the hotel away. Marvin's case in which the railroad is suing him for trespassing also comes up on that date and Bill appears as a witness for the defense and finds he is being sued for divorce. The many legal questions were too much for the spectators and they are completely routed with the hotel going back to the Jones after their reconciliation in the court room.
