KING PLEADS INSANITY DUE TO CRUELTY

(Continued from Page One.) ing on this angle should be considered by the jury," said King. "It is generally known that a man can become paranoiac, insane upon certain subjects. The mania for escaping which developed in Murray was only human nature, and conditions existing at the prison were such as to invite escape, especially to one of paranoiac tendencies.

Was Third Attempt King pointed out that Murray had previously made two successful escapes without any opposition or killing, and that the killings incident to this break were not contemplated or planned. The plan contemplated the taking of guns from the arsenal only as a means of intimidation, he said, and the shooting resulted only when it became evident that they must shoot to save their own lives, after the guards had started the shooting.

"To go forward meant possible death with a chance to escape," said King. "To stay meant sure death with no chance of escape. Self preservation was the inspiration which urged them to go forward."

King contended that Murray had no desire to kill, that he could have killed Guard Gardner as he ran ahead of them toward the state hospital, that he could have killed Zinni Zinn, the taxi driver who drove the convicts to the Pratum neighborhood, and thereby have delayed the pursuit; that he could have killed any or all of the Montfort men, and that he could have murdered any or all of the Newman family, but that he injured none of them.

Argues Not a Murder King declared that the defense refused to admit that the taking of the guns constituted robbery, and challenged on that ground the contention of the state that the killing of Sweeney came within the category of the statute which made murder in the commission of a robbery a crime of first degree murder. He stated that in the opinion of the defense any statute which sought to make a felony of an attempt to protect one's own life is unconstitutional.

The conditions threatening Murray's life, he said, were the presence of the constantly possibility that he might be thrown into the bull pen for an indeterminate sentence, the presence of an insane guard with a "mania for killing" on the bull pen wall, the lack of sanitary facilities in the bull pen, the lack of heat and ordinary comforts in those cells, the lack of exercise allowed convicts confined there, and the fact that convicts in the bull pen had no means of communicating with the outside except through the guards on the wall.

Most of the afternoon yesterday was taken up with the consideration of points of law, and argument on the requested instructions submitted to the court by the defense in the absence of the jury.

Lyle J. Page, deputy prosecutor, made the summary of the state's case late in the afternoon, pointing out that the state had proved "not only beyond a reasonable doubt, but to a mathematical certainty" that Guard Sweeney was killed by a .32-20 calibre bullet

fired from a pistol in the hands of Murray, and that the convict acted with "deliberate malice" in shooting the guard after he had told him to lay down his arms and come out of the tower or he "would smoke him out."

Page told the jury that there had been a complete absence of evidence to substantiate the defense plea of self defense, and that the plea of either temporary or permanent insanity was "too ridiculous to be considered." No man, Page declared, could logically plead insanity when admitting to the mental processes exercised during a break of this kind that had been shown to be exercised by Murray.

"To turn this defendant loose, or to simply send him back to prison would be to say to the four hundred and eighty some convicts confined here, that they, too, might break and kill with impunity with no fear of being punished for their part in it to be sent back to the penitentiary."
