

### EASTERN HORSES WILL BE SEEN IN PORTLAND SHOW

Many eastern entries have already come to the office of A. P. Fleming, manager of the horse show feature of the Pacific International Livestock Exposition which opens Saturday, October 21.

D. G. Welby of Nevada, Iowa, has sent in entries for seven small hackneys and three Shetlands. George J. Peak of Winchester, Ill., has entered four high steppers and six roadsters, headed by St. Merob, winner of the Multnomah hotel \$2000 state here last year. Walter J. Hill of Minneapolis sends six fine hunters; Westbaden Farm sends hackney, Welsh and Shetland ponies; Divan and Son of Monroe, Ill., will again send their Shetlands of the King Largo strain.

Entries are probably enroute from the famous stables of Louisa Long Combs, Longview Farm, at Lee's Summit, Mo., whose harness horses and small hackneys have been almost unbeatable at the long string of shows where they have been exhibited this summer. Mrs. Combs will accompany her horses and does much of the driving, being a most finished reinwoman, of great personal magnetism, with a charming smile that immediately makes her a favorite with spectators. Many of the best horses in the west have come to their present owners from the great breeding establishment at Lee's Summit. This is the first time Mrs. Combs has exhibited at Portland.

Other entries are expected from the east and it is probable that the total will aggregate above sixty head of horses from east of the Missouri river.

### RESULTS UPSET FOOTBALL DOPE

New York, Oct. 19—(AP)—Army and Pennsylvania today stood out as strong eastern candidates for national collegiate football honors after a hectic week of thrills and upsets.

Coach Knute Rockne's Notre Dame warriors, title holders of 1924 and winners of 16 straight victories, have been shunted from the ranks of the contenders by an overwhelming defeat at the hands of the cadets here Saturday, 27 to 0.

Yale, champion team of the "big three," and unbeaten since 1922, fell from immediate consideration under a bruising Pennsylvania blow 16 to 13.

Harvard, counted in the running after an impressive scoring exhibition against Middlebury and Columbia, rated as the strongest New York eleven in years, has been defeated by both Holy Cross and Ohio State.

Pittsburgh, Brown, Penn State and West Virginia are likewise among the teams to show at least one defeat at this point, while records of Princeton, Lafayette, Navy Colgate, Lehigh and Washington and Jefferson include one tie game.

### INTELLECTUALS TURN CRIMINALS

New York, Oct. 19—(AP)—Intellectual criminals who read Shakespeare, studied higher mathematics, used silencers on their pistols and depended on a rabbit's foot for luck, have been revealed with the capture of 12 of 18 members of the "Cowboy" Tessler gang.

The last pair of a dozen under arrest for 28 holdups were taken last night in their luxurious east side apartment, within a block of one of New York's most fashionable sections. Editions of Shakespeare, Boswell's Life of Johnson and treatises on higher mathematics were found on the library table.

Police for lying their victims were under a bed. A rabbit's foot was on the floor. A similar library was found in the Bronx apartment of "Cowboy" Tessler, their leader.

A woman member of the gang, Hamilton, was the armorer. She kept pistols in good condition, issuing them when needed. This task was delegated to her because she

could conceal weapons more easily than a man.

Police say that members of the "cowboy" gang, have been identified as having participated in 28 recent holdups.

### SUIT ASKS REMOVAL OF ADMINISTRATRIX

J. A. Doerfler and C. W. Whitson have filed suit in circuit court demanding the removal of Dora Doerfler, now Dora Pabst, as administratrix of the estate of Kenneth Doerfler.

They state that they made claim to the administratrix for settlement of the claim, which she rejected and that they prosecuted the claim to judgment through the circuit court.
