WINTER COLD SWEEPS CENTRAL WESTERN STATES

Chicago, Oct. 19.—October's reputation as a month of indolent sunshine and quiet autumn beauty has gone by the board this year. Instead of an intermezzo has come the discordant notes of tempest driving snow and cold weather in the middle west. Death even has lurked in that swirling snowflake harbingers of bleak winter days.

Freezing temperatures generally were sprinkled through the prairie and mountain states last night, the lowest mark being registered at Cheyenne, Wyo.—18 degrees. Denver reported 24 and Rapid City, S. D., 26, among other low marks. While rising temperatures were predicted for today over most of the territory, the cold apparently was progressing eastward with lower mercury marks in prospect in the lake states until Tuesday.

Three deaths resulted from winter's first general visit to the northwest, two men being killed at Red Wing, Minn., and one at Minneapolis by trains while they were blinded by snow. From one to four inches fell in various Wisconsin and Minnesota communities.

Nine men, marooned at the summit of Pike's peak when the automobile highway was closed for traffic by heavy snow, were rescued unharmed by a special "cog train." The "sentinel" of the Rockies" is now wintered, except to a few hardy mountain climbers.

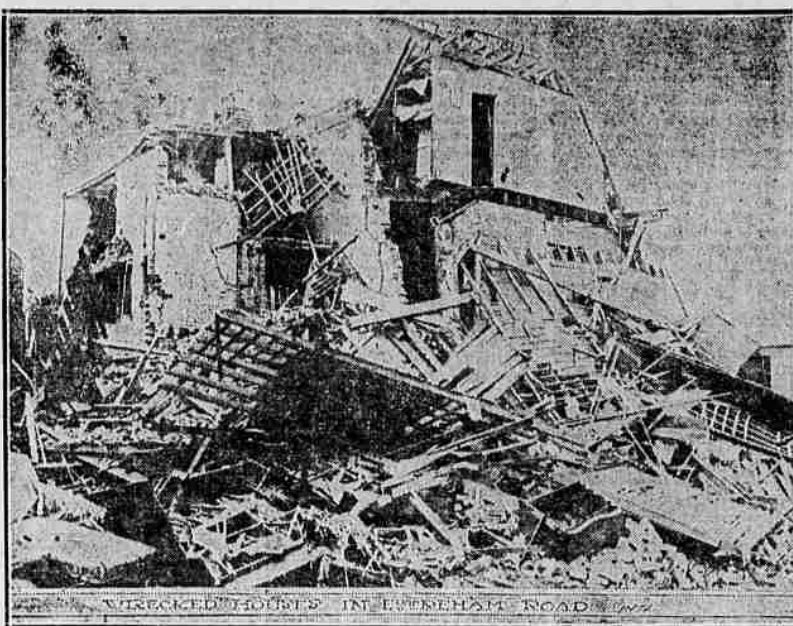

WASHINGTON-LINCOLN MEMORIAL PROPOSED

Rapid City, S. D.—A national shrine, modeled from one of nature's vagaries and situated in the beautiful Black Hills of South Dakota is the vision of Gutzon Borglum, the sculptor, and a group of South Dakota residents who view the Black Hills as the greatest undeveloped wonderlands in the United States.

The shrine would be a monument of Washington and Lincoln, standing side-by-side, their figures carved from a huge needle-like piece of granite which towers 200 feet above its immediate base. Borglum has long held this vision. He expects soon to visit South Dakota to discuss details for raising the \$1,000,000 necessary to its completion.

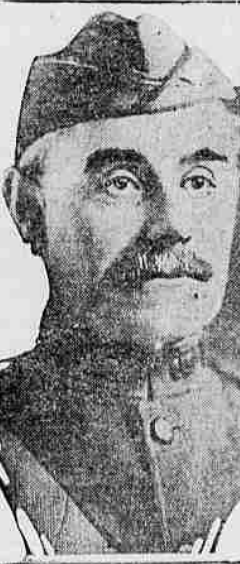

ASKS PROPERTY TRUST TO INSURE CHILD SUPPORT

Louise Claggett has filed a motion to modify the decree of the circuit court in her divorce case against Clyde C. Claggett, asking that real property of the defendant in Marion county, which is considerable, be placed in a trust to assure payment of \$40 a month allowed by the court for support of the children, and also asking that custody of Thomas Claggett, one of the minor children, be transferred from the father to be at Hubbard with the other two children.

The Claggett divorce case was one of the sensations in circuit court here several months ago and brought large crowds flocking to the court room. The case, which went in favor of the wife, was appealed to the supreme court and the mandate affirming the lower court just came down a few weeks ago.

The petition for modification states that the defendant is in California, that it was with difficulty payments were secured pending decision by the supreme court and unless the property here is put in trust to provide for support payments that they will not be paid, as Claggett is now without the jurisdiction of the court here. The petition states that the wife is satisfied with the amount of \$40 a month allotted to her by the court.

Naples, Italy.—A striking example of the mummification of a human body by natural processes has been discovered at Vainita, in the province of Salerno, with the exhumation of the body of a local resident, Rosa Scarpa, who died in 1912. The body was found to
