

PUEBLO BUILT ON ANCIENT RUINS

Albuquerque, N. M., Oct. 19.—(A. P.)—Ruins of ancient pueblo Bonito, New Mexico, which revealed to geologists a pre-historic underground settlement were declared today to be only the "upper story" of still another buried village.

Neil Judd, director of excavations of the National Geographic society, declares that diggings had disclosed the second underground city covers at least three and a quarter acres.

Among the dwellings found in the pueblo, Mr. Judd said there was a building of 800 rooms, of which 500 were on one floor. Many of the underground dwellings stand four stories high, he said.

NEWS BRIEFS

Oakland, Cal.—A. J. Cook, 24, upholsterer, believed to be from Portland, Or., was found hurled to death in the boiler pit of a trans-bay ferry.

Berkeley, Cal.—Police were seeking to establish the identity of an aviator who looped the map over the heads of 45,000 spectators in the California memorial stadium during Saturday's football game.

Berkeley, Cal.—Miss Mary Doyle, 28, who has been missing for six days, was found in the Berkeley foothills in a dazed and half starved condition by a Boy Scout searching party.

Cordova, Alaska.—A terrific gale moved a school building six feet, wrecked a baseball grandstand and blew down scaffolding on a new high school building.

Wrangell, Alaska.—The last boat of the season came down the Sitkine river from the Casimir old region in northern British Columbia with a capacity list of passengers.

Spokane, Wash.—A Spokane congregation heard a sermon preached in Boston, 3500 miles away and transmitted over 4700 miles of telephone wires. Dr. Royal D. Beebe, spoke to his former congregation at St. Paul's Methodist church, from Boston where he now is.

San Diego, Cal.—Captain Paul I. Johnson, 71, port pilot here for 19 years and one of the best known mariners on the southern California coast, died of heart failure in the ocean after being blown away from the side of the steamship Fenster Hall, which he was boarding to bring in off the wharfing buoy.

Los Angeles, Cal.—The body of an unidentified young man, believed slain, was found in a dry river bed near Los Angeles. A bullet hole was found in his chest, but there was none in the coat and shirt buttoned above it.

Reno, Nev.—After walking four miles with his left arm severed at the shoulder, Merrill Graham at Murray, Utah, died at an ERH hospital. Graham fell from a train.

San Diego, Cal.—The submarine S-23 came to the surface nose up and rammed the mine sweeper Ortolan during maneuvers off Point Loma. No one was injured.

Berlin, Germany.—A monarchist speech by General Von Arnim, has led to a protesting demonstration by 7000 in front of the opera house.

Lucerne, Switzerland.—The Swiss town is proud of the illuminated electric sign "Zas," erected on a mountain to encourage the delegates to the security conference.

New York.—Evangeline Booth has a fractured wrist and a sprained shoulder from a fall in her home.

Fresno, Cal.—Transporting orchards by automobile truck is a costly enterprise. Eight dozen orchards valued at \$400 a pair were turned over to the sound manager here after succumbing to the flames of the trip from Los Angeles to Fresno. The 12 survivors of the initial shipment of twenty proceeded toward San Francisco where they are to be exhibited.
