

BORAH THINKS LOCARNO HITS WORLD COURT

Chicago, Oct. 20—(AP)—Senator William E. Borah, chairman of the senate foreign relations committee, today expressed the belief the Locarno treaty would relieve something world affairs but said he did not share the "unwarranted enthusiasm of extremists."

He declared he was glad Locarno had struck a blow at the world court.

Senator Borah came to address the Women's Roosevelt Republican club tonight, virtually to open a campaign opposing the world court.

"By creating a permanent conciliation council the Locarno diplomats, showed, I believe that their faith in the world court as an agent of arbitration is not great," he said.

"I have more faith in the permanent council. Under it the nations at variance are to have power in appointing arbitrators. Nations, therefore, will be more willing to arbitrate then they are under the world court."

"The Locarno pact tend to break the Versailles treaty, which has kept hate alive in Europe since the war. Whatever breaks the Versailles treaty is a boon to humanity. Perhaps the most significant fact of all was the amity of the nations in working out a common plan. To see Germany smile at France, to see France smile with Germany and trust Germany—that is a new promise for Europe."

DIPHTHERIA TEST GIVEN STUDENTS

Monmouth, Or., Oct. 21.—The Schick test for determining susceptibility to diphtheria was given by Dr. William Levin, Portland, of the Oregon state board of health, assisted by Dr. Bowersox of Monmouth in the health offices of the Oregon Normal school to 350 students and faculty members of the Oregon Normal school at Monmouth and to 101 pupils of the Monmouth training school and high school.

The test was repeated on Tuesday morning for 141 pupils of the Independence training center and high school.

Dr. Levin will return on Thursday for the reading of the test and an opportunity will be given later in the term to those who do not have natural immunity for taking the toxin anti toxin for the prevention of diphtheria.
