

TWO MILLION SHARES A DAY SOLD ON STREET

New York, Oct. 21.—(A. P.)—(When the battery of tickers ceases its staccato chatter in the New York Stock Exchange today; when the excited shouting around the trading posts dies down after the closing gong and comparative silence settles over the canyons in the Wall Street district the day's work really begins for an army of 35,000 clerks.

The "tired business man" and the "butter and egg man" may forget the cares of the day at the theater or his supper club in the Roaring Porties, but the myriad lights in the downtown skyscrapers will twinkle far into the night, signifying that weary clerks are heading over their desks, getting everything in readiness for perhaps another two million share day on the morrow.

"Union hours" are unknown in the night clearing house association or in the day time for that matter, in these days of a boiling market. Two o'clock in the morning now is a favorite hour for eating in the financial district, ordinarily as silent as King Tut's tomb in the night hours, are packed, night after night, with clerks gulping down coffee or munching at sandwiches as they compare lists of the day's trading and prepare office records.

But complaints are few. These clerks, who seem to thrive in this atmosphere of feverish excitement know that some day the market will become normal and that Christmas is coming. And at yuletide, brokerage houses distribute exceedingly generous bonuses to the faithful.

Perhaps thirty thousand of these clerks are employed in houses connected with the New York stock exchange; the others with the curb and consolidated exchanges. This is a high water

mark and the call has gone out for more help.

For a week, Wall street has been witnessing two million share days. The street does not often go through this experience.

BAKER CITIZEN KILLED BY AUTO

La Grande, Oct. 21.—James Romig, 27, of Baker, was instantly killed at 11:30 o'clock Monday night when struck by an automobile driven by C. H. Getchell on the Old Oregon Trail near Hot Lake, Oregon.

According to officers who investigated the accident, Romig had taken a friend to Hot Lake after an evening spent in La Grande. He was returning to La Grande when he stopped the machine. Presumably he was putting water in the radiator when Getchell's car struck him.

Coroner Halston said an inquest would be held late today. Romig, who was a surveyor for the Central Railroad of Oregon, with headquarters at Union, Ore., was the son of Mr. and Mrs. James Romig of Baker.

FRENCH QUELL INSURRECTION OF SYRIAN TRIBES

Damascus, Syria, Oct. 21.—(A. P.)—An insurrection which broke out here last night, with infiltrating groups of Druze tribesmen assisted by local elements, has been put down by the French forces.

Bands of tribesmen filtered into the southern section of the city, were joined by local inhabitants

and at 9 o'clock last night suddenly attacked the French occupants.

The troops managed to remain in possession of the public utilities and buildings and the military establishments, against which the insurgents directed a continuous rifle fire.

The French artillery replied by bombarding the insurgent quarters throughout the night and continued today. Armored cars and tanks were called into action.

The Moslem section of the city suffered heavy damage both from rebel incendiaries and the French bombardment.

The French say their own losses were slight.

Late this afternoon Moslem insurgent leaders accepted the terms of surrender offered by General

Sarrail, the French high commissioner in Syria, which called for the payment of a heavy fine and
