

FASHION FOLLIES IN VAUDEVILLE HEILIG, FRIDAY

For those who enjoy good songs and dancing, with a liberal supply of side-splitting comedy, the next Association Vaudeville bill to be presented at the Heilig theater tomorrow night will provide a pleasant evening's entertainment.

"The Fashion Follies" with Violet Holand is an outstanding example of what can be accomplished along artistic lines when the material is placed in the hands of a competent producer. It is a cleverly arranged routine of songs, steps and musical numbers which in themselves would provide satisfactory entertainment for the average playgoer. However, this augmented by a series of style draping demonstrations on the figure of a "Perfect 36" which runs throughout the act and furnishes the theme for the title. From old fashioned to Jazz. The style shown on the young lady depicts the outstanding vogues from the year '76 up to the date. It provides a very interesting exhibit of the ever changing modes which makes the woman and breaks the man, sometimes.

Thousands of vaudeville fans on the Chicago to the coast tour will chuckle with glee when they learn that the famous comedy team, Rice and Gady are making a return trip. The tall thin "guy" and the little chubby Dutchman have an original way of putting over their stuff that never fails to produce the laughs, which is precisely and exclusively what they are supposed to do.

There are so few equilibrium ladders in the business that when they come along they are always a welcome innovation. One of the chief reasons why they are so scarce is owing to the extremely dangerous nature of the work. The "Lino-tree-O" however, have been doing this hazardous stunt for years and are past masters in the art. They have the nerve, courage and skill that makes a success.

Imitators are as a rule, more or less frowned upon. Not so with Billy Eldert of the firm of Ray and Eldert who present a "Rural Oditty." His specialty is imitations of birds, and barnyard habitues with which we are more or less familiar. They are worked into this rural sketch in a fascinating manner.

Harking back to the days of crinolines, hoop skirts and lavender, Rinehart and Duff present "Songs of Today and Yesterday" in one of the most beautifully staged and happily arranged harmony singing acts ever offered to the variety world. In addition to wonderfully arranged settings and exquisite rows of almost endless designs the girls themselves are about as easy to look at as any that have appeared in the recollection of the best known long memories. The act opens with a rather unique prologue set to music designed to give the audience a feeling of the nature of the act, then switches to another setting in which the girls sing a routine of modern melodies and gradually works back to the old timers, changing their costumes continually as they proceed from one song to another. It is one of those refreshingly wholesome presentations that exudes satisfaction combined with pleasing personalities every minute of the fifteen.

Short subjects and the regular orchestra number by the Heilig theater concert orchestra will complete the entertaining program.

PLAN MEMORIAL FOR W. WILSON

Staunton, Va., Oct. 22.—Hon. Erwin A. Tull of Portland has accepted the chairmanship for Oregon of the Woodrow Wilson birthplace memorial at Staunton, according to announcement made today by Dr. A. M. Fraser, general chairman.

Friends and admirers of the war president in all parts of the country are back of the plan to establish a national shrine to Mr. Wilson in the city of his birth. This house in Staunton in which Woodrow Wilson was born, will be the central figure in the birthplace memorial group. The chapel in which Woodrow Wilson was baptized and in which his father preached during his Staunton pastorate will be restored to its original condition. The Woodrow Wilson memorial hall of Mary Baldwin college, with which the Wilson family was identified for many years, will complete the memorial group. The entire memorial will be endowed.

Friends of Mr. Wilson in all parts of the country are greatly interested in the birthplace memorial plans," said Dr. Fraser today, "and on every hand the committee is meeting with fine responses to the appeal for active co-operation necessary to assure complete success of the program."

FARMERS UNION HEAR DALZELL

Dallas, Oct. 22.—The 1926 state convention of the Farmers Union will be held in Monmouth the third week in May. This decision was reached at the quarterly meeting of the county Farmers Union held last Saturday at Elkins, according to L. H. McBee of Dallas who presided.

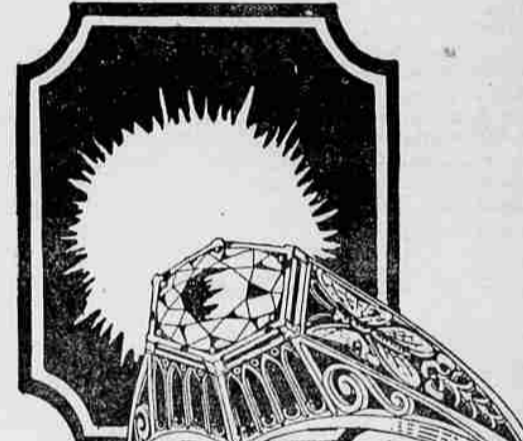
