

RENEWED ACTIVITY SEEN IN LOCAL HOP MARKET

1500 BALES OF HOPS SOLD AT 18 TO 23 CENTS

The hop market has taken on a brisk turn with 1500 bales or so sold yesterday and in the neighborhood of 3000 bales changing hands within the past week. Prices have ranged from 18 to 23 cents and buying is said to be still going on.

Under a revised estimate, carefully checked over by local hopmen, it is considered likely that there still are about 10,000 bales remaining unsold in growers' hands. An estimate of 8000 bales remaining was made a week or so ago, but a check has changed these figures, even in the face of the heavy selling of the past week. The total crop was estimated at 80,000 bales.

Smith & Johnson and Harold Ray are said to have been among the heavy buyers in yesterday's purchases. Some of the crops sold included Mrs. George Ross, 140 bales; Sloper lot of 300 bales; D. Peon, 140 bales; Chung Poy, 132 bales; McKinley Mitchell, 165 bales and Lee Wah, 148 bales, and a number of other sales not definitely reported yet.

Local hopmen consider this buying an out of the ordinary considering circumstances and it is considered likely that buying will keep up at intervals until the crop is sold. It is considered unlikely that the market will go back up to the 25 cent figure of a few weeks ago and growers are more and more getting into the mood to sell.

FRED WILLIAMS IS PRAISED FOR PUBLIC SERVICE

Fred A. Williams, attorney of Salem, was given credit by John A. Carlin, city attorney of Medford and a member of the state legislature, in a recent speech with having done more for southern Oregon than any other man who ever held office in Oregon. Williams was formerly a member of the public service commission and is now interested in preventing the Jacksonville-Medford road from being dismantled. The Medford Sun of October 19 quotes Mr. Carlin as follows:

"Let us get behind Fred Williams, the man who did more for southern Oregon than any other state official has ever done, and these progressive citizens of Jacksonville and Medford who are trying to save the road for us, and give them a helping hand," said City Attorney John A. Carlin today.

"Would that we had more men like Fred Williams, who as things in state affairs, rather than those who promise much and do little."

Mr. Carlin was discussing the importance of the old Jacksonville-Medford railroad being preserved, as emphasized at the public hearing held Thursday on the dismantling of the road application by W. S. Barnum, its owner. Then he continued as follows:

"It will be recalled that some six or eight years ago, when the P. & E. was decreed, and no one wanted to pay taxes on it, that there was much talk of junking the road, and if my memory serves me correctly, the wheels were started toward doing so. But Fred Williams, a Grants Pass lawyer, who had just gone on the public service commission, seeing into the future farther than some of us, opposed it and with the help of some of the southern Oregon delegation of the legislature, as I recall, Senator Thomas and others got through a resolution making the road to southern Oregon."

"That has been the result of one large bill already, which is to be followed by a still larger one as soon as the Owens people can make arrangements."

"With the Hill and Southern Pacific lines both fighting for this southern territory, it does not require much foresight to see that one or both of them are going to build more lines in our section and it does not require much of a public lawyer."

WHEAT LOWER CORN CLOSES FIRM

Chicago, Oct. 22.—The wheat opening, 1/4 to 1 cent lower, new style, December 11.43 1/2 to 11.44 1/2 and May 11.14 1/2 to 11.15 1/2, was followed by a slight rally and then by a drop to 11.41 1/2 for December and 11.40 1/2 for May.

After opening unchanged to 1/4 cent off, December 7 3/4 to 7 1/2 cents, corn landed a little, but then declined again.

Starting unchanged to 1/4 cent lower, December 39 1/2 to 39 3/4 cents remained at about initial level. Wheat closed weak, 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 cent lower new style, December 1.41 1/2 to 1.41 3/4 and May 1.39 1/2 to 1.39 3/4.

Corn closed firm at the same as yesterday's finish, December 7 3/4 to 7 1/2.
