At a meeting of the Silverton budget committee the estimated expenses and receipts for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1925, were drawn up. The total estimated expenses for the year are \$30,905. The total estimated receipts are \$27,235 which leaves \$3670 to be raised by special levy.

The expenses are divided out as follows: personal services—recorder, \$400; chief of police \$1200; police No. 1, \$1020; extra police, \$50; street commissioner, \$1200; street cleaning, \$500; attorney, \$400; other services, \$400; material and supplies—fuel, \$210; light, \$2000; water, \$250; printing, stationery and postage, \$400; maintenance and repairs, paved street, \$2500; macadam streets, \$500; building, \$100; indebtedness—intersection bonds (principal) \$1500; city hall bonds, (principal) armory

aid bonds (principal) \$1000; interest on bonds—intersection bonds, \$1210; sewer bonds, \$1500; city hall bonds, \$1000; armory air bonds, \$600; warrants and interest thereon, \$1370; fire department—salary of fireman, \$400; new equipment, \$1000; supplies, \$250; repairs, \$625; emergency, \$500; sewer building and maintenance fund, \$6250.
