Pittsburgh, Pa., Oct. 27.—A number of Pirate supporters, who placed their money on the Pittsburgh club and then thought they had "cleaned up" when their favorites won the championship, now find that they did not win a cent, police having received numerous complaints within the last few days that the money was "covered" with bogus certified checks.

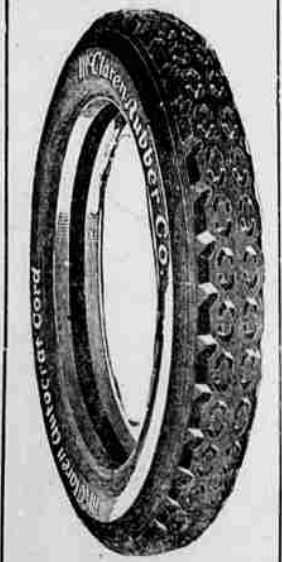
Among the bettors who found their "checks" to be worthless was a former pugilist, who bet \$25,000. In another instance a theatrical manager placed \$5,000 but did not realize on his "investment." Other wagers ranging from \$50,000 to \$500 have come to the notice of police who figure that a total of \$100,000 was covered by the spurious paper.

Inspector of Detectives John Barry says there is no way in which the winners can be collected, although there might be gleaned a few crumbs of satisfaction by prosecuting the men who posted the checks on charges of issuing worthless paper. That is, if the men can be located.

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Pardon For Portland Tailor Void Asserts Multnomah Attorney

Portland, Or., Oct. 27.—Governor Pierce's pardon of Ernest J. Elmgren, Portland tailor who was sentenced to a year in jail in Multnomah county for extortion, was entirely illegal, declared District Attorney Stanley Myers. Myers declared that Pierce did not take cognizance of constitutional law governing executive clemency and that therefore "the Elmgren pardon isn't worth the paper it is written on."

He points out that Pierce pardoned Elmgren without the legally required formality of consulting with the district attorney or with Judge Robert Tucker, who sentenced Elmgren.

Pierce declares that his pardon was based on the fact that Judge Bean of the federal court paroled Elmgren from the bench. Elmgren also appearing in that court on a charge of using the mails to defraud. It appears, however, that the pardon was more on the strength of a petition made before the governor by a man named Morgan, a representative of the Apostolic Faith Mission.

Concerning legal requirements for a pardon, District Attorney Myers said:

"These requirements provide in part, that: 'When application is made to the governor for a pardon, before granting same he must require the judge of the court in which conviction was had, or the district attorney by which the action was prosecuted, to furnish him with a statement of facts proved at the trial, and of any other facts having reference to the propriety of granting or refusing the pardon.'"

"The law also states that at least 20 days before application for pardon is made to the governor written notice of intention to apply must be sent by the applicant to the district attorney."

In none of these details, said Mr. Myers, was the method of the Elmgren pardon made valid, and for that reason, he holds, Governor Pierce widely overstepped his executive prerogatives.

Elmgren pleaded guilty to a charge of attempted extortion in circuit court after he had pleaded guilty in federal court to a charge of using the mails with intent to defraud in the same case

Pasadena, Cal., Oct. 27.—(A.P.)—A football team made up mostly of the late Walter Camp selections for all-American honors is being organized by the Pasadena American Legion for a game at the Rose Bowl, Armistice day, November 11, with a gridiron aggregation from the U. S. S. Melville.

The Legion team is being coached by "Tuffy" Conn, former Oregon star, who will also appear at half-back in the game. The Melville eleven, United States battle fleet champions for 1924, is one of the strongest of the naval teams and is said to be again headed for the title.

Others who will play with the team are Norman Anderson, former University of Southern California tackle; Bill Blawitt, former California quarterback; Archie Niebet, California fullback; Harold "Brick" Muller, California end, and Clarence "Babe" Horrell, California center.



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ASK PROBE OF RATES ON CONCRETE PRODUCTS

The Concrete Pipe company of Portland has petitioned the public service commission for an investigation of the freight rates on concrete fence posts, declaring they are so high that the commodity does not move.

The Winkleman Bag & Burlap company wants information as to how it can proceed toward getting a reduction in the rate on bags. The company is having difficulties, says the letter, with the Transcontinental Freight bureau.

C. S. Goldberg, a Portland attorney, has filed a complaint with the commission against the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph company, demanding that he be listed in the telephone directory as a patent attorney.

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
