

### SALEM HOSPITAL ACCREDITED AS STANDARDIZED

From the 1925 survey of 2395 hospitals in the United States and Canada 1564 or 65.7 per cent meet the requirements of Hospital Standardization by the American College of Surgeons. In the state of Oregon out of 29 hospitals surveyed 12 or 41.4 per cent have been accredited and appear today on the approved list as announced by the American College of Surgeons.

The asterisk indicates that certain hospitals have accepted the requirements which result in the best scientific care of the patient but are not, for the lack of time or other acceptable reasons, carrying them out in every detail.

Oregon—100 or more beds: Emanuel Hospital, Portland; Good Samaritan Hospital, Portland; Multnomah County Hospital, Portland; Portland Sanitarium, Portland; St. Vincent's Hospital, Portland.

50 to 100 beds: Eugene Hospital, Eugene; Mercy Hospital, Eugene; Pacific Christian Hospital, Eugene; Portland Surgical Hospital, Portland; Sacred Heart Hospital, Medford; St. Mary's Hospital, Astoria; Salem Hospital, Salem; United States Veterans' Hospital, No. 77, Portland.

The hospitals whose names appear on the approved list today are those recognized as fulfilling the fundamental requirements for good service to the patient, as assured through (a) efficient organization; (b) adequate diagnostic and therapeutic facilities; (c) trained personnel; (d) complete case records; (e) periodic check-up or medical audit of the clinical work of the hospital.

### IMMODEST DRESS IS CONDEMNED BY JEWS

New York, Oct. 27.—(A. P.)—Immodesty in dress, especially on the part of women attending the synagogue, was condemned in a resolution passed by the Union of Orthodox Jewish congregations at the final session of the convention of the Jewish center yesterday. The stand of the Roman Catholic church in harrasing scantily clad from church also was praised.

The resolution described the convention as looking "with disfavor upon the laxity of conduct so greatly prevalent at present and particularly the manner of attire at present customary among the female sex which cannot be considered decent and modest. We urge the daughters of Israel to clothe themselves with proper modesty."

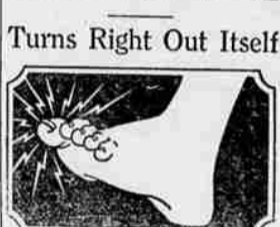

To the Editor:—"Auto-De-Fa," this subject of your editorial in your issue of October 14 assumes that the Episcopal church in general convention assembled would burn at the stake and enter in a persecution of all who do not believe as taught by it. You use the case of Bishop William M. Brown as an illustration of this position on your part. Let me say that as a rule members of the Episcopal church are not near as prejudiced as are some who are atheistic.

Your editorial on the above subject is misleading and unjust. Bishop Brown has not been persecuted and would not have been persecuted if he had not sought an office if he had not sought the publicity for many years and forced action. His deposition was not because of his beliefs but because he had violated the very vow he made him a bishop. I submit that one should be honest, especially as an officer of the church. And Bishop Brown should be honest enough to have resigned himself. He seemed to desire the newspaper publicity, and I hear that the sale of his book has increased. Much that has appeared in the press that is not in accordance with the facts, so

one must conclude that what most newspaper reporters know about ecclesiastical affairs is not much. I wonder why the good things that we are doing here are not mentioned in the western newspapers but always the sensational realness. But what I want most is to plead for exact honesty and sincerity; and the case of Bishop Brown cannot be used to illustrate honesty and some doubt his sincerity. H. D. CHAMBERS.

### WILLS DEFEATS JOHNSON IN ONE ROUND HANDILY

Newark, N. J., Oct. 27.—(AP)—Harry Wills had a quick but indecisive one round heavyweight victory over Floyd Johnson to his credit.

While ten thousand spectators in the first regiment armory yelled "fake," a towel was flung unexpectedly from the corner of the boxer who had been heralded before the match as the "Iowa bulldog," what was to have been a 12 round, no decision event ended two minutes and two seconds after the opening of the first round last night.

Johnson appeared to the spectators to be far from out when the towel fluttered. He was on his feet and had not been knocked down.

After the match, a physician representing the state boxing commission, examiner Johnson and declared he was fit.

"I was punk-drunk," said Johnson.

Wills entered the ring weighing 215 pounds, 12 pounds more than his opponent. The negro immediately carried the fight to his opponent, sinking a left to the stomach and then bringing the same hand up to the head. A right hand wallop to the head then drove Johnson to the ropes. He had his hands up in defense when the towel was flung.

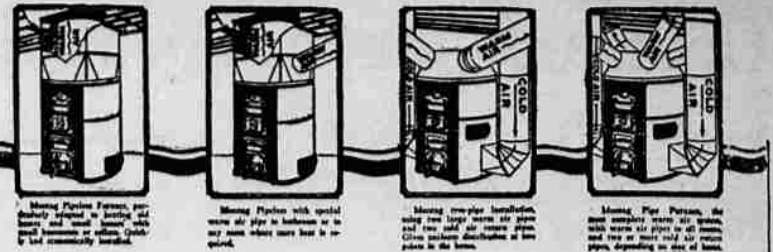

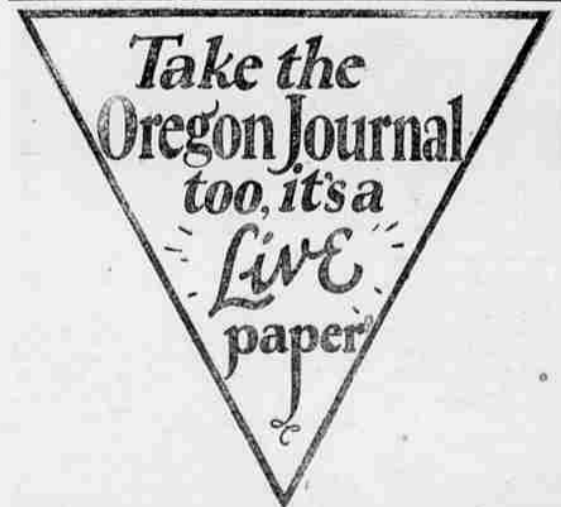
