

GERMANY TO ACT ON LOCARNO PACT SOON, IS BELIEF

New York, Oct. 29.—(AP)—Early action by the German Reichstag upon the Locarno pact was forecast by Paul Loebe, president of that body, when he sailed on the Hamburg-American liner Deutschland. The Reichstag will be summoned to take up the treaty immediately upon its arrival, he announced.

"I believe the Locarno agreements are an important to the peace of Europe," he said, "I should be accepted by the German republic, and I shall throw all my strength and power toward this end."

Germany will be in the league of nations "where she properly belongs," by the end of the year, he asserted.

On the issue of a possible restoration of a monarchy in Germany Mr. Loebe said: "The Kaiser cannot come back in the first place, because of the interior political situation in Germany, and secondly, because of the entente and pressure from without."

"We have organized in Germany more than one million workers who would not hesitate to go to war to prevent a restoration of the monarchy."

Corvallis, Oct. 29.—"The line has had a world of attention this week," Coach Schlaster said. "Every man is able to play, and there are lots of things they won't do Saturday that they did in their first conference game against Stanford. playmates. The Montanans have increased greatly in prestige since they held Gonzaga to a 14 to 14 tie two weeks ago, for last week Gonzaga beat the colorful University of Idaho team 12 to 9.

INDIAN TRIBES GATHERING FOR ANNUAL PARLEY

Spokane, Wash., Oct. 29.—History was being re-enacted today in Spokane but with a decidedly modernized aspect.

As in the old days, the Indian tribesmen of the Pacific northwest are gathering for their encampment beside the falls. But unlike the days of half a century ago, the braves and their squaws are arriving not on cayano-back with trailing wickups, but in six cylinder automobiles or by first class railroad transportation.

Chief Eagle of the Nez Perce, true son of Indian warriors and one of the three tribesmen who called on President Coolidge earlier this month with an invitation to attend the Northwest Indian Congress here tomorrow and Saturday, in town, but he is not hovering over a campfire smoking a meditative pipe, or parading in paint or feathers for the edification of the white man.

"He never wore one," Superintendent O. C. Lipps of the Nez Perce agency replied, "and he doesn't care to."

LOGS OF SUNKEN SUBMARINE ARE TO BE EXAMINED

Boston, Oct. 29.—(A. P.)—Evidence brought to light when the sunken submarine S-51 is raised, including engine room and deck logs, will be held before the naval board of inquiry investigating the collision of Block Island, which cost the lives of 33 men.

The board has exhausted its list of witnesses, including those from the steamship City of Rome, involved in the collision, and adjourned sine die, pending the raising of the S-51. If the vessel is not raised within a month, it was announced the board will be reconvened to clear up the case and make its findings.

Testimony to the effect that late in August the New York-Boston steamer H. P. Dimock came within 50 or 60 feet of colliding with a submarine in Long Island Sound last August because the submarine failed to show required lights, was introduced at the hearing today.

The testimony was given by Roland M. Litchfield, second officer of the steamer, called today by counsel for the Ocean Steamship company, which operated the steamer City of Rome and which was involved in the collision with the S-51, in which the submarine was sunk with 33 men on the night of September 25 last.

LEGISLATORS DEBATE EFFECTS OF BAD BOOZE

Washington, Oct. 29.—(A. P.)—The house ways and means committee today swept aside for a while the mass of complexities involved in making a tax bill to give a thought to the after-effects of bootleg liquor.

"Does liquor made from denatured alcohol cause death, just slow death, or is it harmful at all?" Representative Crip, democrat, Georgia, asked Martin J. Zinner, Jersey City chemist, representing dealers in toilet articles, who seek reduction of the alcohol tax.

"The high class bootlegger," the witness replied "undoubtedly aims to reduce the poison so that slow death is the maximum penalty, but the clumsy sometimes kill off their customers too quickly."

Windsor, Ont., Oct. 29.—(A. P.)—Only one Windsor cafe, District Licensee Inspector Maxine N. Mousseau announces, has asked for a renewal of its license to sell 4.4 beer. The fiscal year ended today and time for application of renewal of licenses was fixed for this date but it was unofficially reported the time will be extended until May 1. Brewery reports of sales indicate the 4.4 beer demand has been declining steadily until it has reached virtually the vanishing point.
