

FORMER SALEM HIGH BOY STARS WITH MARINES

Bob Fargo, former Salem high school student who is with the marines at Mars Island, is playing excellent football, according to several clippings sent to his mother who resides in Salem. Fargo went to Salem high about a year and a half ago but quit school to join the marines. During the first year there he made the football team and has been one of the mainstays of the team this year.

A letter to his mother giving an account of one of their games with the St. Ignatius varsity football team tells of the ability of the marines. The marines lost the game 13 to 0 but only after a hard fought game.

In the second half Fargo, who is quarter for the Mars Island team, was knocked out and had to be taken out of the game. Fargo said that he didn't remember anything after that. The marines kicked to the Ignatius team who tried an off-tackle play with two men running interference. Fargo met the first man head-on and knocked him out of the play, getting to the other two men to take them out of the way and make the tackle on the ball carrier. When the carrier got up Fargo was knocked out. The rest of the team claimed that Fargo was knocked out when he met the first man, that he got rid of the interference and the ball carrier while dazed. When he came to, the game was over, the St. Ignatius team making two touchdowns in the last quarter.

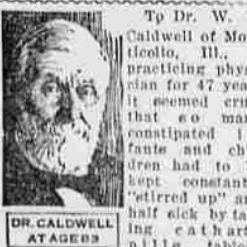

35,000 TROUT ARE PLANTED

Mill City, Or., Nov. 3.—Approximately 35,000 young trout were planted near Detroit, Friday, distributed as follows: 8,000 Boulder creek, 10,000 Hansen creek, 2,000 Mackay creek, 10,000 Brettenbush river and 5,000 Tumble creek. This is the first trout that have been planted up that far for a number of years, and with the continuance of the good work, will insure good fishing for the large number of fishermen that are being attracted to the vicinity of Detroit through the opening of the new Mill City-Detroit highway.

BRIDGE OF THE GODS TO BE RECONSTRUCTED

Portland, Or., Nov. 3.—(A. P.)—The fabled "bridge of the gods" across the Columbia river just below the Cascade locks, is to be reconstructed in modern steel. Legends of the redmen say that once a stone archway spanned the river at this point.

Contracts for construction of the bridge have just been signed, and work will begin at once. The structure will be ready for use by next July, it is announced. About three years ago work was begun on the new "bridge of the gods," but was abandoned.

Walla Walla, Wash., and Portland financiers are back of the company which is building the bridge, which will cost \$690,000. The bridge will be 1,526 feet long, exclusive of approaches. It will be of the cantilever type with the middle span 705 feet, long over in the northwest.
