

DOCTOR GOES ON TRIAL FOR DEATH OF LITTLE GIRL

Denver, Colo., Nov. 4.—(A. P.)—Dr. Harold E. Blazer, aged physician, went on trial today in the Arapahoe county district court at Littleton, a suburb, charged with the murder of his helplessly crippled daughter, Hazel Blazer, 32 years old, who never grew from babyhood.

Prosecutor Joel Stone's first questions to prospective jurors sought to determine whether the fact that the victim was an imbecile and a helpless cripple would cause them to reject evidence that she was a human being.

"Did she or did she not have the right to life?" Stone asked the first juror. Upon objection by defense Attorney Lewis D. Mowry, the court warned the prosecutor against discussing problem testimony with prospective jurors.

The defense has indicated it will attempt to show that Dr. Blazer was insane at the time of the slaying and that his act was justified by the circumstances.

CREW OF BURNED VESSEL RESCUED

New York, Nov. 5.—(A. P.)—The crew of 17 men of the freighter Algiers, which burned Sunday night off the Virginia coast, was rescued by the British steamer Ransay, the maritime exchange was informed today by wireless from the British ship.

The rescued crew members are now aboard the Ransay, which is bound for Queenstown. No details of the rescue were given in the radio message from Ransay's captain, which was the first definite word that had been received of the crew since their ship burned.

Burning of the Algiers was reported by the Birmingham City which went to the freighter's aid in answer to an S. O. S. on Sunday night. When the Birmingham City arrived the Algiers was enveloped in flames and no sign of life was seen aboard.

KILLER OF SON INSANE

Kelso, Wash., Nov. 5.—(A. P.)—Mrs. Cora Zeck, Cowlitz county woman who Monday killed her 5-year-old son with an ax, was late Wednesday adjudged insane by a board of physicians and ordered committed to the state asylum by Judge Homer Kirby.

CARDINALS TO BATTLE HUSKIES SATURDAY IN FIRST CRITICAL GAME

Stanford University, Cal., Nov. 5.—(A. P.)—Stanford's powerful gridiron machine, flying the blazing red banner of leadership in the Pacific coast conference, will steam out of its home area tonight in search of new fields to conquer.

But the quest will soon end. For at Seattle the Cardinals are due to clash with the Washington football eleven next Saturday. That juggernaut of the north also is undefeated and equally determined to keep its conference since coast. Stanford only assumes top position in the conference by virtue of three victories and no defeats.

Washington has won two games and lost none. California rounds out the trio of undefeated teams with no conference losses and one victory.

It is the belief of the Cardinal coaches that if Stanford is going to be defeated by a college eleven this year, that defeat will come at the hands of the University of Washington next Saturday. Therefore Coach Glen Warner this week has drilled his men for their hardest game of the season.

In their 35 to 13 defeat of Oregon last week, the Cardinals proved that they are essentially an offensive team. They scored five touchdowns against the northerners and should have had one or two more.

Lines Strengthened.

Seattle, Wash., Nov. 5.—(A. P.)—University of Washington football coaches are looking forward to a battle of lineups Saturday when the powerful Cardinal eleven invades the northland to take on the Huskies in the stadium here.

Although both Stanford and Washington have several green men in their respective forward walls, concentration by coaches on defense has developed strong machines, the Husky mentors believe.

The Husky and Cardinal lines are about equal in weight and the outcome of the game will depend a great deal upon the schooling the squads have received.

The Washington squad has pretty much recovered from injuries received in the Washington State college game last Saturday.

POWERFUL ST. MARY'S TEAM TO CLASH WITH MULTNOMAH

Oakland, Cal., Nov. 5.—(A. P.)—Another California football invasion of the north began last night when St. Mary's varsity entrains for Portland, where the Oakland squad is billed to meet the strong Multnomah Athletic club next Saturday. Twenty-two players will make the trip.

The Saints, fortified by a newly acquired offense and strengthened by the return to normal condition of several injured players, will swing into action Saturday probably better equipped than at any time of the season. Coach Ed "Stop" Madigan said today he was hoping for a dry field at Portland. The Saints use the Notre Dame shift and this system of play necessarily demands firm purchase for football cleats.

STOCK TRADING BREAKS RECORD

New York, Nov. 4.—(A. P.)—Trading on the New York stock exchange today broke all records for volume in the last twenty years when total stock sales ran above 2,800,000 shares as compared with 2,702,000 on October 16 the previous record. The price movement was highly irregular with the main trend upward. United States Steel common was a market leader, jumping over five points to a new high record at 134 1/2, the highest since 1917.

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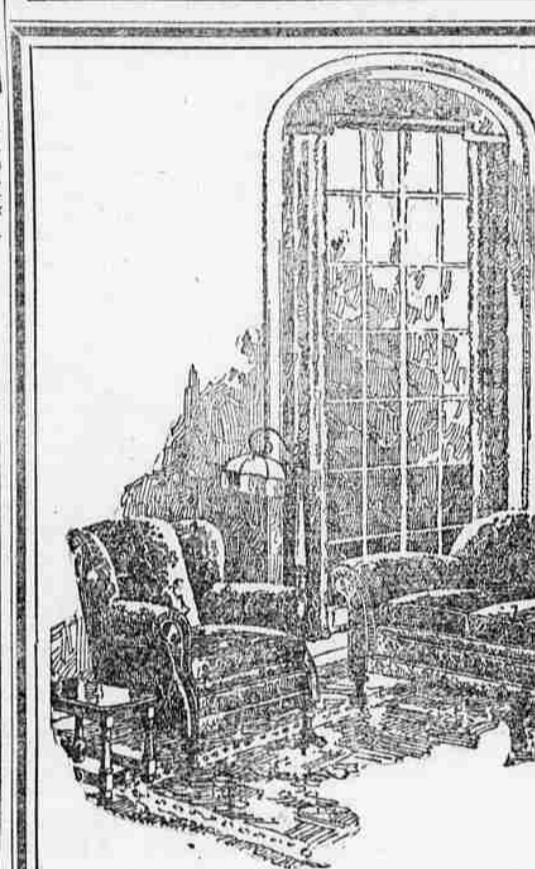
