

SMITH-DRILLING OREGON LINE FOR AGGIE CONTEST

University of Oregon, Eugene, Nov. 5.—(Special)—With the homecoming Oregon-Oregon Aggie football game less than 14 days away, Coach Smith of Oregon is putting his team through the stiffest kind of drill, Smith, more than anyone else, realizes the fact that Oregon's main weakness is in the defense. So far this season the team has failed to live up to its traditional reputation of fighting when within its own 19-yard line.

The San Francisco and Oakland newspapers, in commenting on the Oregon-Stanford game, bear out Smith's contention that Oregon is beginning to hit its stride on the offense. If it can improve in tackling and blocking, Oregon might again loom as a dangerous opponent to Washington.

In spite of the fine showing by the Aggies this season, Oregon having played only ordinary football—the Aggies are only six-point favorites, and before the game may meet the Webfooters on even terms.

The improvement of the Oregon team may be shown by some of the reports on the Oregon-Stanford game. The following, in the Oakland Tribune, is an excerpt of Theon Wright's story:

"In Jones, Wetzel and Anderson, Coach Smith has a trio of backs who would be formidable in any team. With a powerful line and a little more versatility in attack, he should be a threat to any of the conference leaders. Jones went through Stanford for consistent gains and Oregon's passing attack proved almost as successful as Stanford's.

"Mauiz, the lucky Oregon captain, should be a serious contender for an end berth on the all-coast eleven. He is a good pass receiver and break up plays with starting regularity.

"The fact that Stanford was scored upon by Oregon was no disgrace to the Cards. Coach Smith's team will soon be in a position to give like treatment to any of its other conference opponents."

Allan T. Baum, sports editor of the San Francisco Examiner, who saw both the Oregon-California and the Oregon-Stanford game has the following to say about Oregon: "Yesterday against Stanford, Wetzel punned effectively, taking more time with his kicks and holding his own against what little kicking the Cardinals backers did. He was also strong in other departments.

"Jones was the big drive in most of the first Oregon touch-down and finished up the second one. Mauiz did stellar work both on the defensive and receiving forward passes."

OCTOBER COURT TERM IS CLOSED

After going in full blast since October 5, the October term of circuit court closed today and Judge Kelly discharged the jury this morning. 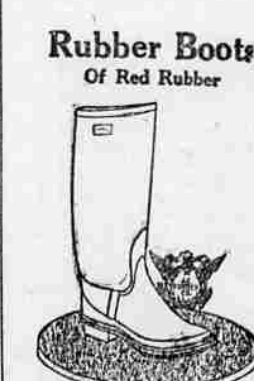
