

WILD TURKEYS TO BE ADDED TO OREGON'S GAME

Oregon may soon include wild turkeys among its game birds. The October report of E. F. Avarill, state game warden says that three wild turkeys, a rooster and two hens are soon to be received from the Woodmont Road and Gun club of Woodmont, Maryland, in exchange for two Columbia blacktail deer recently sent the latter. The birds will be received at the Pendleton game farm. Arrangements for the exchange were made early this year, says Mr. Avarill, by former Game Warden Burghdoff.

Joseph Hendricks has been placed in charge of the Pendleton farm and Lawrence Demagalski has been returned to the Eugene game farm, the report says. Over \$1000 is to be spent in improving the residences at the Eugene farm and the Corvallis farm is to receive 100 new brood coops at \$2.50 each.

A saving of over \$1200 annually has been effected, says the report, by a discontinuance of the practice of furnishing groceries to men employed on the hatcheries and egg-taking stations in the vicinity of Bend.

District Deputy Game Warden Hestlin of Canyon City recently brought from the Deer Flat reservation in Idaho 10,000 perch which were planted in water not suitable for trout near Burns. The Idaho game department will accept in return either salmon or pheasant eggs.

All trout to be liberated now from the Dolph creek hatchery have been distributed, the report says. Particular attention has been given to stocking the streams adjacent to Multnomah and Clark counties since these two portions of the money received from the sale of angling licenses. A total of 85,200 fingerling trout have been liberated in Sandy river and tributaries, 48,500 in the Molalla and tributaries and 1,949,500 in the Clackamas and its tributaries.

At a later meeting the state game warden will recommend that the smaller tributaries of all these streams be closed to angling. "With the closing of the season on deer and upland birds," says the report, "the services of all special deputy game wardens have been terminated. Only the force of regular wardens is now in the field. It is believed the expense of the regular deputies can be curtailed to a great extent without decreasing the efficiency of the service. The co-operation of the wardens toward this end is already bearing fruit and it is believed that from \$500 to \$1000 a month can be saved."

Indications are that Chinese pheasant hunters were not as successful as in former years, especially in the Willamette valley. Large numbers of birds were taken, however, in Coos, Klamath, Jackson and Josephine counties.

white Malheur county furnished the largest number of birds. In Umatilla county, while shooting was better than in the Willamette valley, it was not up to the standard of the last three previous seasons in that county. This is attributed to the freezing out of the winter wheat which made it necessary for the birds to nest in the stubble which was burned over and plowed under about the time of the nesting season, and also to cold rains about the time the young birds were leaving the nests. Fall caused a severe loss in Wasco and Sherman counties.

It is believed more deer were bagged than in any previous season for many years. "The number of elk in that section of the blue mountains adjacent to the corners of Umatilla, Grant, Union and Baker counties is probably large enough to justify a limited open season on adult bull elk," says the report.

Some systematic method of making a game census of the state is advocated.

SALMON EGGS ARE SHIPPED

Mill City, Or., Nov. 6.—One million two hundred thousand chinook salmon eggs have been shipped from the racks near Breton-bush to the Santiam hatchery at Mehama, being accompanied by Mr. Ledgerwood, manager of the hatchery. There are approximately five million more eggs to go forward from Bretonbush. From the racks on the south fork of the Santiam, 1,750,000 eggs have been shipped to Bonnaville hatchery, 600,000 will be shipped in a few days to the Deschutes hatchery, and there will be approximately 1,250,000 more to follow. It is estimated that there will be thirteen million eggs secured from the two Santiam river racks this year, exceeding any former take by three million eggs.
