

# PRISON GUARDS AT WALLA WALLA QUIT UNDER FIRE

Walla Walla, Wash., Nov. 9.—(A. P.)—Night Chief Turney A. Zandell and Guard Sam M. Carrithers resigned their positions at the state penitentiary late this morning, following Warden Long's investigation of their conduct during the break early Saturday morning when three convicts made their escape over the wall.

Warden Long stated that Zandell, in making his rounds, saw the convicts preparing to leave the hospital with their ladder, but instead of attacking them, or giving a general alarm, he passed Guard McCaulley at the entrance of the cell building, with only a muttered "there's something doing," and then ran to number 4 tower, out of sight of the hospital, called for a ladder from the guard and climbed to the top of the wall to advise the guards and to get a gun. Both he and McCaulley were unarmed. This gave the convicts about ten minutes more time during which they climbed over the wall. Carrithers said he saw the last convict go over but that his gun struck and he could not fire. Warden Long asked him why he did not shoot one of his two other guns and he had no ready answer.

# 14 RUM RUNNERS HOVER OFF COAST

New York, Nov. 10.—(A. P.)—Fourteen ships of the rum row fleet have reappeared off the New York coast laden with holiday drinks.

New tactics have been evolved to meet any repetition of the coast guard blockade of last summer that drove away the vessels anchored there. The new flotilla does not anchor; when coast guard vessels make their appearance, the little armada takes to its heels until coast guard vessels run out of fuel and have to go to port for replenishment. Business goes on during their absence.

Skippers returning from the sea report that not only has the group off New York grown to 14 in number, but that four vessels are hovering near Boston, and others further south.
