FRENCH TO OPEN DRIVE TOMORROW

French aviators were bombing the insurgents within plain sight of Damascus.

FOREST TAXING PROBLEM TO BE STUDIED FULLY

A nation-wide study of the forest taxation question relative to reforestation of privately owned lands has been started by the federal forest service, according to information received by F. A. Elliott, state forester and Professor Fred B. Fairchild of Yale university has been named director of the investigation.

A detailed study of forest taxation will be made in all principal forest districts to determine the effect of the present tax laws on reforestation and timber holdings, factories in Russia.
